- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 5-01-08 and 5-02-06 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to persons under twenty-one years of age and licensed premises where
- 3 alcohol beverages are sold.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 5-01-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7	5-01-08. Persons under twenty-one years of age prohibited from manufacturing,				
8	purchasing, consuming, or possessing alcoholic beverages or entering licensed				
9	premises - Penalty - Exceptions - Referrals to addiction facilities - Jurisdiction.				
10	<u>1.</u>	Except as permitted in this section and section 5-02-06, any \underline{a} person under			
11		twenty-one years of age manufacturing may not manufacture or attempting			
12		attempt to manufacture alcoholic beverages, purchasing purchase or attempting			
13		attempt to purchase alcoholic beverages, consuming consume or having have			
14		recently consumed alcoholic beverages other than during a religious service, being			
15		be under the influence of alcoholic beverages, or being be in possession of			
16		alcoholic beverages , or furnishing <u>furnish</u> money to any person for such <u>the</u>			
17		purchase , or entering of an alcoholic beverage.			
18	<u>2.</u>	A person under twenty-one years of age may not enter any licensed premises			
19		where alcoholic beverages are being sold or displayed, except a restaurant when			
20		accompanied by a parent or legal guardian, or in accordance with section 5-02-06,			
21		or if the person is a law enforcement officer or other public official entering enters			
22		the premises in the performance of official duty, or if the person enters the			
23		premises for training, education, or research purposes under the supervision of a

12	<u>1.</u>	Exc	ept as permitted in this section, any licensee who dispenses alcoholic		
13		bev	erages to a person under twenty-one years of age, or who permits such a		
14		pers	son to remain on the licensed premises while alcoholic beverages are being		
15		solo	or displayed, is guilty of a class A misdemeanor, subject to sections 5-01-08,		
16		5-0 ⁻	1-08.1, and 5-01-08.2.		
17	<u>2.</u>	Any	person under twenty-one years of age may remain in a restaurant where		
18		alcoholic beverages are being sold if <u>:</u>			
19		<u>a.</u>	If the restaurant is separated from the room in which alcoholic beverages are		
20			opened or mixed and gross sales of food are at least equal to gross sales of		
21			alcoholic beverages which are consumed in the dining area, if;		
22		<u>b.</u>	If the person is employed by the restaurant as a food waiter, food waitress,		
23			busboy, or busgirl under the direct supervision of a person twenty-one or		
24			more years of age and is not engaged in the sale, dispensing, delivery, or		
25			consumption of alcoholic beverages, or if;		
26		<u>C.</u>	If the person is a law enforcement officer or other public official entering who		
27			enters the premises in the performance of official duty-; or		
28		<u>d.</u>	If the person enters the restaurant for training, education, or research		
29			purposes under the supervision of a person twenty-one or more years of age		
30			with prior notification of the local licensing authority.

- <u>3.</u> Any person under twenty-one years of age may remain in an area of a site where
 beer, wine, or sparkling wine is sold in accordance with the conditions of an event
 permit issued pursuant to section 5-02-01.1.
- 4 Any person who is nineteen years of age or older but under twenty-one years of <u>4.</u> 5 age may be employed by the restaurant to serve and collect money for alcoholic 6 beverages, if the person is under the direct supervision of a person twenty-one or 7 more years of age, but may not be engaged in mixing, dispensing, or consuming 8 alcoholic beverages. Any establishment where alcoholic beverages are sold may 9 employ persons from eighteen to twenty-one years of age to work in the capacity of 10 musicians under the direct supervision of a person twenty-one or more years of 11 age.
