1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 5-01-08 and 5-02-06 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to persons under twenty-one years of age and licensed premises where

3 alcohol beverages are sold.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 5-01-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 5-01-08. Persons under twenty-one years of age prohibited from manufacturing, 8 purchasing, consuming, or possessing alcoholic beverages or entering licensed 9 premises - Penalty - Exceptions - Referrals to addiction facilities - Jurisdiction. Except 10 as permitted in this section and section 5-02-06, any a person under twenty-one years of age 11 manufacturing may not manufacture or attempting attempt to manufacture alcoholic beverages, 12 purchasing purchase or attempting attempt to purchase alcoholic beverages, consuming 13 consume or having have recently consumed alcoholic beverages other than during a religious 14 service, being be under the influence of alcoholic beverages, or being be in possession of 15 alcoholic beverages, or furnishing furnish money to any person for such the purchase, or 16 entering of an alcoholic beverage, or enter any licensed premises where alcoholic beverages 17 are being sold or displayed, except a restaurant when accompanied by a parent or legal 18 guardian, or in accordance with section 5-02-06, or if the person is a law enforcement officer or 19 other public official entering who enters the premises in the performance of official duty, or if 20 the person enters the premises for training, education, or research purposes under the 21 supervision of a person twenty-one or more years of age with prior notification of the local 22 licensing authority. A violation of this section is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. The court 23 may, under this section, refer the person to an outpatient addiction facility licensed by the state 24 department of human services for evaluation and appropriate counseling or treatment. offense of consumption occurs in the county of consumption or the county where the offender is
 arrested.

3 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 5-02-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 5-02-06. Prohibitions as to persons under twenty-one years of age - Penalty -6 **Exceptions.** Except as permitted in this section, any licensee who dispenses alcoholic 7 beverages to a person under twenty-one years of age, or who permits such a person to remain 8 on the licensed premises while alcoholic beverages are being sold or displayed, is guilty of a 9 class A misdemeanor, subject to sections 5-01-08, 5-01-08.1, and 5-01-08.2. Any person 10 under twenty-one years of age may remain in a restaurant where alcoholic beverages are being 11 sold if the restaurant is separated from the room in which alcoholic beverages are opened or 12 mixed and gross sales of food are at least equal to gross sales of alcoholic beverages which 13 are consumed in the dining area, or if the person is employed by the restaurant as a food 14 waiter, food waitress, busboy, or busgirl under the direct supervision of a person twenty-one or 15 more years of age and is not engaged in the sale, dispensing, delivery, or consumption of 16 alcoholic beverages, or if. A person may enter and remain on the licensed premises if the 17 person is a law enforcement officer or other public official entering who enters the premises in 18 the performance of official duty- or if the person enters the licensed premises for training, 19 education, or research purposes under the supervision of a person twenty-one or more years of 20 age with prior notification of the local licensing authority. Any person under twenty-one years of 21 age may remain in an area of a site where beer, wine, or sparkling wine is sold in accordance 22 with the conditions of an event permit issued pursuant to section 5-02-01.1. Any person who is 23 nineteen years of age or older but under twenty-one years of age may be employed by the 24 restaurant to serve and collect money for alcoholic beverages, if the person is under the direct 25 supervision of a person twenty-one or more years of age, but may not be engaged in mixing, 26 dispensing, or consuming alcoholic beverages. Any establishment where alcoholic beverages 27 are sold may employ persons from eighteen to twenty-one years of age to work in the capacity 28 of musicians under the direct supervision of a person twenty-one or more years of age.
