- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 20.1-05-03 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to unlawfully taking big game animals; and to provide a penalty.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-05-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 20.1-05-03. Season for taking and transporting big game Bag limit Civil penalty
- 7 **for unlawful taking.** A person An individual having a big game hunting license as prescribed in
- 8 this title may take, kill, and transport, during the open or lawful season, one big game animal in
- 9 this state. In addition to the penalty provided in section 20.1-05-01, an individual who
- 10 <u>unlawfully takes a bighorn sheep, elk, or moose is subject to a civil penalty for the replacement</u>
- 11 value of the animal of five thousand dollars for a bighorn sheep, three thousand dollars for an
- 12 elk, and two thousand dollars for a moose. For a trophy animal over two and one-half years of
- 13 age, the civil penalty for the replacement value of the animal is an additional fifty percent of the
- 14 penalty. A penalty collected under this section must be used for the future management of the
- 15 species for which the penalty was collected. The open or lawful season on deer and antelope
- 16 begins at twelve noon central standard time and on elk, moose, and bighorn sheep begins
- 17 one-half hour before sunrise on any designated Friday as established by gubernatorial
- 18 proclamation in accordance with this title. This section does not prohibit the transportation,
- 19 shipment, or possession within this state of properly tagged big game legally taken in other
- 20 states.
