- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-27-12 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to per student payments for English language learners.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-27-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 15.1-27-12. Per student payments Limited English proficient students language learners.
 - 1. In addition to any other payments provided for by this chapter, each school district is entitled to receive:
 - a. Four hundred twenty-five dollars for each student who has been assessed by the student's school district and found to have negligible limited English language skills, as evidenced by a classification of level I using the Woodcock Munoz language survey;
 - b. Three hundred twenty-five dollars for each student who has been assessed
 by the student's school district and determined to have very limited English
 language skills, as evidenced by a classification of level II using the
 Woodcock Munoz language survey; and
 - e. Two hundred twenty five dollars for each student who has been assessed by the student's school district and determined to have limited English language skills, as evidenced by a classification of level III using the Woodcock Munoz language survey The amount of money that results from multiplying the per student amount calculated under subsection 5 by 10.0 for each English language learner determined to have preliterate English language skills and a proficiency level of I;

18			individual's level of English language proficiency; and		
19		d.	Must have difficulty speaking, reading, writing, and understanding English, as		
20			evidenced by a language proficiency test approved by the superintendent of		
21			public instruction and aligned to the state English language proficiency		
22			standards.

29			district must complete the student assessment required by subsection 1 and

22			<u>(1)</u>	Level I students are assigned a weighting factor of 10.0;			
23			<u>(2)</u>	Level II students are assigned a weighting factor of 8.0;			
24			<u>(3)</u>	Level III students are assigned a weighting factor of 4.0;			
25			<u>(4)</u>	Level IV students are assigned a weighting factor of 8.0.			
26	<u>6.</u>	The	super	intendent shall distribute the payments no later than May thirtieth of each			
27		scho	chool year. The superintendent shall prorate payments under this section for any				
28		stud	students registering in the school district after the start of the school year or				
29		departing from the school district prior to the completion of the school year.
