- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-27-12 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to per student payments for English language learners.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-27-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 15.1-27-12. Per student payments Limited English proficient students language
 learners.
- In addition to any other payments provided for by this chapter, each school district
 is entitled to receive:
- 10a.Four hundred twenty-five dollars for each student who has been assessed by11the student's school district and found to have negligible limited English12language skills, as evidenced by a classification of level I using the13Woodcock Munoz language survey;
- 14 b. Three hundred twenty five dollars for each student who has been assessed
 15 by the student's school district and determined to have very limited English
 16 language skills, as evidenced by a classification of level II using the
 17 Woodcock Munoz language survey; and
- 18c.Two hundred twenty five dollars for each student who has been assessed by19the student's school district and determined to have limited English language20skills, as evidenced by a classification of level III using the Woodcock Munoz21language survey The amount of money that results from multiplying the per22student amount calculated under subsection 5 by 10.0 for each English23language learner determined to have preliterate English language skills and a24proficiency level of I;

2				calculated under subsection 5 by 8.0 for each English language learner
3				determined to have beginning English language skills and a proficiency level
4				<u>of II;</u>
5			<u>C.</u>	The amount of money that results from multiplying the per student amount
6				calculated under subsection 5 by 4.0 for each English language learner
7				determined to have intermediate English language skills and a proficiency
8				level of III; and
9			<u>d.</u>	The per student amount calculated under subsection 5 for each English
10				language learner determined to have basic English language skills and a
11				proficiency level of IV.
12	2	2.	In order to be eligible for assessment under this section, a student:	
13			a.	Must be at least five years of age but must not have reached the age of
14				twenty-two;
15			b.	Must be enrolled in a school district in this state;
16			C.	Must have a primary language other than English or come from an
17				environment in which a language other than English significantly impacts the
18				individual's level of English language proficiency; and
19			d.	Must have difficulty speaking, reading, writing, and understanding English, as
20				evidenced by a language proficiency test approved by the superintendent of
21				public instruction and aligned to the state English language proficiency
22				standards.
23	3	3.	In o	rder to be eligible for the payment provided for in this section, a school district
24			mus	st provide an approved program of instruction for students who have negligible
25			limit	t ed <u>preliterate</u> English language skills, very limited <u>beginning</u> English language
26			skill	s, or limited intermediate English language skills <u>, or basic English language</u>
27			skills.	
28	4	1.	<u>a.</u>	In order to receive the full payment provided for in this section, a school
29				district must complete the student assessment required by subsection 1 and
30				forward the results to the superintendent of public instruction on or before
31				December first of each school year assess each eligible student using a

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1			proficiency test that is aligned to the state English language proficiency
2			standards and the state language proficiency test.
3		<u>b.</u>	On or before December first of each year, a school district shall submit to the
4			superintendent of public instruction an application for payment. The
5			application must include:
6			(1) <u>A description of the district's English language learner program;</u>
7			(2) The result of the district's annual student assessment required under
8			subdivision a; and
9			(3) Any other information requested by the superintendent of public
10			instruction.
11	<u>5.</u>	<u>a.</u>	Each year of the biennium the superintendent of public instruction shall
12			calculate the total weighted number of students eligible for payment during
13			that year by determining the sum of all English language learner students
14			weighted as follows:
15			(1) Ten times the number of level I students;
16			(2) Eight times the number of level II students;
17			(3) Four times the number of level III students; and
18			(4) The number of level IV students.
19		<u>b.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction shall determine the per student
20			amount used to calculate payments under this section during the first year of
21			the biennium by dividing the total weighted number of students eligible for
22			payment under this section into forty-nine percent of the total amount
23			appropriated for this section.
24		<u>C.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction shall determine the per student dollar
25			amount used to calculate payments under this section during the second year
26			of the biennium by dividing the total weighted number of students eligible for
27			payment under this section into fifty-one percent of the total amount
28			appropriated for this section.
29	<u>6.</u>	The	e superintendent shall distribute the payments no later than May thirtieth of each
30		sch	ool year. The superintendent shall prorate payments under this section for any

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- 1 students registering in the school district after the start of the school year or
- 2 departing from the school district prior to the completion of the school year.
