- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact four new sections to chapter 15.1-18 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to teacher qualifications; to amend and reenact sections 15.1-13-08,
- 3 15.1-18-01, and 15.1-18-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to teacher
- 4 qualifications; to provide for a report; to repeal section 15.1-18-03 of the North Dakota Century
- 5 Code, relating to high school teacher qualifications; and to provide an effective date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

9	15. ⁻	1-13-08. Board duties. The board shall:
10	1.	Supervise the licensure of teachers.
11	2.	Set standards for and approve teacher preparation programs.
12	3.	Seek the advice of teachers, administrators, school board members, teacher
13		education professors, and other interested citizens in developing and updating
14		codes or standards of ethics, conduct, professional performance, and professional
15		practices.
16	4.	Adopt, in accordance with chapter 28-32, codes or standards of ethics, conduct,
17		professional performance, and professional practices.
18	5.	Make recommendations for the inservice education of individuals engaged in the
19		profession of teaching.
20	6.	Issue major equivalency endorsements and minor equivalency endorsements.
21	7.	Appoint an executive director to serve at its discretion.
22	8.	Authorize the executive director to employ personnel, subject to approval by the
23		board.

1		b. Is approved to teach in that area by the education standards and practices
2		board; and
3		c. Meets all requirements set forth in rule by the superintendent of public
4		instruction.
5	<u>2.</u>	An individual may teach Native American languages provided the individual is an
6		eminence credentialed teacher.
7	<u>3.</u>	An individual may teach in the areas of trade, industry, technical occupations, or
8		health occupations, provided the individual has been issued a license to teach in
9		such areas by the education standards and practices board.
10	SE	CTION 8. REPORT - TEACHER LICENSURE PROCESS. On or before July 1,
11	2004, the e	education standards and practices board shall report to a committee designated by
12	the legislati	ive council regarding pontential changes to the licensure process.
13	SE	CTION 9. REPEAL. Section 15.1-18-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
14	repealed.	
15	SE	CTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 2 through 7 and section 9 of this Act
16	become eff	fective on July 1, 2008.
