## ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1420

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 4-34 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to records of cattle transactions; to amend and reenact sections
- 3 4-34-02, 4-34-03, 4-34-04, 4-34-05, 4-34-06, 4-34-08, and 4-34-10 of the North Dakota Century
- 4 Code, relating to the North Dakota beef commission; and to provide a penalty.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 4-34 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 created and enacted as follows:

8	Cat	tle purchasers - List of sellers to commission - Certain records exempt from
9	disclosure	- Penalty.
10	<u>1.</u>	The commission may adopt rules requiring the purchaser of cattle subject to
11		assessment under this chapter to furnish the commission with the names of
12		persons from whom the cattle were purchased. Any person who knowingly
13		refuses to furnish the commission with required information is guilty of a class B
14		misdemeanor.
15	<u>2.</u>	Except as otherwise provided by law, the following records are not subject to
16		section 44-04-18 and section 6 of article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota:
17		a. Records furnished to the commission pursuant to subsection 1;
18		b. Records furnished pursuant to section 2 of this Act; and

- 19c.The identity of a person requesting refund of an assessment under section204-34-11, and the amount of the person's requested refund.
- 3. This section does not limit the issuance of general statements based upon the
   reports of persons subject to this chapter, or the publication by the commission of
   the name of any person violating this chapter and a statement of the manner of
   violation by that person.

1 **SECTION 2.** A new section to chapter 4-34 of the North Dakota Century Code is

2 created and enacted as follows:

10		<u>d.</u>	The amount of assessment remitted;
11		<u>e.</u>	The basis, if necessary, to show why the remittance is less than the number
12			of head of cattle multiplied by the per head assessment; and
13		<u>f.</u>	The date any assessment was paid.
14	<u>2.</u>	<u>Eacl</u>	h person subject to this section shall maintain and make available for
15		insp	ection by the commission or its agents the records required by this section,
16		inclu	iding records necessary to verify any required reports. The records must be
17		mair	ntained for the period of time that the commission may prescribe by rule, but
18		<u>the r</u>	records must be maintained for at least three years.

3		three years.
4	<u>9.</u>	"Person" includes individuals, corporations, limited liability companies,
5		partnerships, trusts, associations, cooperatives, and any and all other business
6		units.
7	<del>9.</del> <u>10.</u>	"Selling agency" means any person engaged in the business of buying or selling in
8		commerce livestock on a commission basis.
9	SEC	CTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 4-34-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
10	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:
11	4-34	4-03. North Dakota beef commission - Appointments - Vacancies -
12	Qualification	ons.
13	1.	There is hereby created a North Dakota beef commission consisting of nine
14		members who must be appointed by the governor. The commission must be
15		composed of three beef producers, one cattle feeder, one dairy producer, one
16		public livestock market representative, and three representatives at large. The
17		Subject to section 4-34-05, the commission may also appoint up to two nonvoting
18		<del>ex officio</del> members.
19	2.	Three initial members must be appointed for one year; three members must be
20		appointed for two years; and three members must be appointed for three years.
21		All subsequent members must be appointed for three years unless the
22		appointment is to fill a vacancy in which case such appointment must be for the
23		unexpired term. No members may serve more than two successive three-year
24		terms. In the event a position on the commission becomes vacant for any reason,
25		the unexpired term of such position must be filled in the same mode and manner
26		as the original appointments. In addition to those causes enumerated under
27		section 44-02-01, a position on the commission is deemed vacant if a member fails
28		to attend, without justification, three consecutive meetings of the commission.
29	3.	Each member must:
30		a. Be a United States citizen and a resident of this state;

1		b.	Be actually engaged in that phase of the cattle industry the member
2			represents;
3		C.	Have been actually engaged in that phase of the cattle industry for a period of
4			five years; and
5		d.	Have during that period derived a substantial portion of the member's income
6			therefrom; and
7		<u>e.</u>	Except for the public livestock market representative, be a participating
8			producer.
9	SEC	TION	<b>5. AMENDMENT.</b> Section 4-34-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is

18	Not I	ess t	han two nominations must be submitted for each office to be filled. Upon the
19	expiration of	the i	initial appointments, only those organizations which have the authorization to
20	nominate ca	ndida	ates representing the specific classification for which an opening or openings
21	exist are elig	gible	to submit nominations. The initial appointments must be made immediately
22	after the effe	ective	e date of this chapter.

28	2.	The	commission shall elect a chairman presiding officer and such other officers as
29		it <del>de</del>	<del>ems</del> <u>determines</u> advisable.
30	3.	The	commission shall employ and discharge at its discretion such personnel,
31		<u>inclu</u>	iding agents, as the commission determines are necessary to carry out the

1		purposes of this chapter, and to prescribe their duties and powers and to fix their
2		compensation.
3	4.	The commission is empowered to adopt <del>, rescind, and amend reasonable</del> rules <del>,</del>
4		regulations, and orders for the exercise of its powers hereunder. The provisions of
5		chapter 28-32 <del>shall</del> apply to this chapter.
6	5.	The commission is authorized to establish by resolution a headquarters centrally
7		located within the state of North Dakota which shall continue until so changed by
8		the commission.
9	6.	The commission may require that the person or persons who receive and disburse
10		the moneys of the commission must be bonded, by and in the amount to be
11		determined by the commission. The premium for such bond or bonds must be
12		paid by the commission from assessments collected.
13	7.	The commission shall deposit its funds in a special account in the state treasury.
14	8.	The commission may incur expenses and enter into contracts and create such
15		liabilities as may be reasonably necessary for the enforcement of this chapter.
16	9.	The commission may borrow money, not in excess of its estimate of revenue from
17		the current year's assessments.
18	10.	The commission shall keep or cause to be kept accurate records of all
19		assessments, expenditures, moneys, and other financial transactions performed
20		pursuant to this chapter. Such records, books, and accounts must be audited by
21		the state auditor, in accordance with established auditing and accounting
22		procedures.
23	11.	The commission may prosecute in the name of the state any action to enforce
24		collection or assure payment of the assessment authorized by this chapter, and
25		sue and be sued as a commission without individual liability for acts of the
26		commission within the scope and powers conferred upon it by this chapter.
27	12.	The commission is empowered to cooperate with any person or any local, state, or
28		national commission, organization, or agency, whether voluntary or established by
29		state or federal law, including recognized livestock groups, engaged in activities
30		similar to the work of the commission and to make contracts and agreements for

1		carrying out programs consistent with the purpose and intent of this chapter and to
2		expend funds in connection with this chapter.
3	13.	The commission may appoint up to two nonvoting ex officio members for a term of
4		one year that may be extended on an annual basis and the commission shall
5		adopt policies to further define ex officio nonvoting member eligibility and term
6		limitations.
7	<u>14.</u>	The commission may accept grants, donations of funds, property, and services, or
8		other assistance, financial or otherwise, from federal, state, and other public or
9		private sources for the purpose of aiding and promoting the work and objectives of
10		the commission, and shall deposit all funds received under this subsection in the
11		North Dakota beef commission fund in the state treasury.
12	<u>15.</u>	The commission may contract with similar entities and qualified beef councils in
13		other states.

The 14 moneys collected pursuant to this chapter must be paid to the commission 15 pursuant to this chapter and must be expended by the commission only as 16 authorized by this chapter that the assessment levied upon the person from 17 who the person purchased cattle, if an assessment was due, has been 18 collected and has been remitted, or will be remitted in a timely fashion. 19 Any person seeking nonproducer status under this section who willfully provides a 3. false or misleading certification to the commission is guilty of a class B 20 21 misdemeanor. 22 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 4-34-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 23 amended and reenacted as follows: 24 4-34-10. Remittance of assessments collected - Penalties. All assessments

collected by licensed dealers, selling agencies at terminal markets, or auction markets, or
required to be paid by any other person as provided in this chapter must be remitted to the
North Dakota beef commission no later than the fifteenth day of the month following the month
in which the cattle were sold. The assessments must be accompanied by remittance forms as
prescribed and furnished by the commission. All moneys collected by the commission pursuant
to this chapter must be remitted by the commission to the state treasurer and deposited by the
state treasurer in the North Dakota beef commission fund and are hereby appropriated to the

1 commission and must be disbursed by the commission in accordance with this chapter. Any 2 licensed dealer, selling agency at terminal markets, auction markets, or any other person 3 required to remit assessments but who fails to remit the assessments as required by this 4 chapter within thirty days following the month in which the cattle were sold is guilty of a class B 5 misdemeanor. Any licensed dealer, owner or operator of a selling agency at a terminal market, 6 livestock auction market operator or any other person required to collect assessments but who 7 fails to collect assessments as required by this chapter is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. Any 8 person who sells cattle from the state of North Dakota outside the state or to an out-of-state 9 buyer who fails to remit the assessments required by this chapter within thirty days following 10 the month in which the cattle were sold is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. Any unpaid 11 assessments due pursuant to this chapter must may be increased by two percent each month 12 beginning with the day following the date the assessments were due. Any remaining amount 13 due which includes any unpaid charges previously due pursuant to this section, must may be 14 increased at the same rate on the corresponding day of each month thereafter until paid. The 15 timeliness of the remittance of an assessment as required by this chapter must be based on the 16 applicable postmark date or the date the assessment is actually received by the commission. 17 The commission is authorized to may sue for and collect assessments and any penalties on 18 unpaid assessments.
