- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-27 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to transportation aid payments to school districts; to amend and reenact
- 3 sections 15.1-29-01, 15.1-30-01, 15.1-30-04, 15.1-30-15, and 15.1-32-16 of the North Dakota
- 4 Century Code, relating to reimbursement for transportation services provided by school
- 5 districts; and to repeal sections 15.1-27-26, 15.1-27-27, 15.1-27-28, 15.1-27-29, 15.1-27-30,
- 6 and 15.1-27-31 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the school district transportation
- 7 funding formula.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA: 8

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is 10 created and enacted as follows:

11 School district transportation - State reimbursement.

- In order to be eligible to receive transportation aid payments, a school district shall: 1.
 - Determine the number of students for whom the district will provide a. transportation during the school year;
 - b. Determine to the closest one-tenth of a mile [.161 kilometers] the distance from the home of each student identified in subdivision a to the school in which the student is enrolled, using the most convenient route of public travel;
 - Using the process provided for in subsection 2, determine the total one-way <u>C.</u> mileage for all students to be transported; and
 - Submit the total one-way mileage to the superintendent of public instruction d. on or before October first of each year.
 - In order to determine the transportation aid payments to which a school district is <u>2.</u> entitled during each year of the biennium, the superintendent of public instruction shall:

1		<u>a.</u>	Add the total mileage submitted by each school district under subdivision d of
2			subsection 1 to determine the total state mileage.
3		<u>b.</u>	Divide the total appropriation for state transportation aid to school districts for
4			the applicable year of the biennium by the total state mileage determined
5			under subdivision a to arrive at a per student transportation amount.
6		<u>C.</u>	Forward to each eligible school district transporting students the per student
7			transportation amount multiplied by the number of students the district has
8			determined will be transported during the school year.
9	<u>3.</u>	The	superintendent of public instruction shall forward payments due under this
10		sect	ion in the same manner and at the same time as other payments are made
11		fron	the state to school districts, except that the first payment from the state must
12		<u>be r</u>	nade in November of each year.
13	<u>4.</u>	<u>lf a</u>	school district fails to submit the total one-way mileage to the superintendent of
14		pub	lic instruction on or before October first as required by subsection 1, the
15		sup	erintendent shall deem the district ineligible to receive transportation payments
16		<u>duri</u>	ng that school year.
17	SEC	CTIOI	N 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-29-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
18	amended a	nd re	enacted as follows:
19	15.1	-29-0	01. Education of students in bordering states - Payment of tuition.
20	1.	Stud	dents may attend a school in a bordering state in accordance with section
21		15.1	-29-02 under the following circumstances:
22		a.	A student who lives within forty miles [64.37 kilometers] of another state or in
23			a county bordering on another state may, with the approval of the school
24			board, attend a public school in a bordering state.
25		b.	A student who has attended a school district in a bordering state since, and
26			including, the 1990-91 school year must be permitted to continue attending
27			school in the district in the bordering state.
28		c.	A student whose sibling attended an out-of-state school during or before the
29			1990-91 school year must be permitted to attend school in the district the
30			sibling attended in the bordering state.

1 2. If the school board of the district in which the student resides denies a request for a 2 student's attendance in and payment of tuition to another state, the student's 3 parent may appeal the decision to the three-member committee referenced in 4 section 15.1-29-06. 5 If the three-member committee determines that the student meets the terms 6 of subdivision b or c of subsection 1, the student may attend school in the 7 bordering state and the board of the student's school district of residence shall 8 pay the tuition. 9 If the three-member committee determines the student falls within the terms of b. 10 subdivision a of subsection 1, then the three-member committee shall make 11 its decision using the criteria specified in section 15.1-29-06. 12 C. Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, if a student's school district of 13 residence does not provide for the education of kindergarten students, the 14 district may not pay tuition for a kindergarten student to attend school in a 15 bordering state. 16 Any decision by the three-member committee regarding the payment of tuition d. 17 for high school, elementary, or kindergarten students may be appealed by the 18 school board or by the student's parent to the state board of public school 19 education. A decision by the state board is final. 20 3. The superintendent of public instruction shall forward all per student and a. 21 transportation aid payments for a student attending an out-of-state school to 22 the student's school district of residence. 23 The student's district of residence may reduce any tuition payment it must b. 24 make to an out-of-state school by an amount commensurate with the tuition 25 costs the district would be entitled to receive as compensation for a student 26 from the out-of-state district enrolled in its school. 27 C. Transportation payments for a student attending school in a bordering state 28 must be determined as provided in section 15.1-27-27 1 of this Act. 29 4. Nothing in this section requires that a school district of residence provide student 30 transportation or payments in lieu of transportation for students attending

out-of-state schools.

1 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-30-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 2 amended and reenacted as follows: 3 15.1-30-01. Transportation or meals and lodging - Options of school board. 4 The board of a school district may: 5 Provide for the transportation of a student to and from school; or 6 b. If acceptable to the student's parent, reimburse the parent for expenses 7 incurred in providing meals and lodging to the student outside the student's 8 home, provided that the reimbursement may not exceed the amount permitted 9 under subsection 4 of section 15.1-27-27. 10 2. A parent receiving payments under section 15.1-30-02 is not eligible to receive 11 payments under this section. 12 3. If the board elects to provide for the transportation of students by public transit, the 13 board shall establish eligibility criteria based on a minimum distance between a 14 student's residence and the school. Except as otherwise provided by law, the 15 board shall apply the criteria equally to all students in the district. 16 4. Benefits under this section are available even if a student is transported to another 17 school district in or outside this state, provided the student's attendance meets all 18 other conditions established by law. 19 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-30-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 20 amended and reenacted as follows: 21 15.1-30-04. Provision of meals and lodging for high school students - Payment 22 permitted - Levy. Instead of providing transportation so that an eligible high school student 23 residing in the district can attend school in another district, a school board may pay a 24 reasonable allowance to the student's parent for costs incurred in the provision of meals and 25 lodging for the student at a location other than the student's residence. A school district that 26 furnishes either transportation or an allowance for the provision of meals and lodging for a 27 student under this section may levy a tax pursuant to subdivision a of subsection 1 of section 28 57-15-14.2 for this purpose. A district may not count a student receiving an allowance for

meals and lodging under this section as a student to whom transportation is provided for

3	15.1-30-15. Transportation services to nonpublic students - Joint provision of				
4	transportation services.				
5	1.	If th	ne board of a school district provides transportation services to its students, the		
6		boa	ard may provide transportation services to students attending nonpublic schools		
7		pro	vided:		
8		a.	The nonpublic school students are transported only along the bus route		
9			established for the public school students;		
10		b.	The nonpublic school students are transported only on the days and at the		
11			times that the public school students are transported; and		
12		c.	The legal passenger capacity of each bus is not exceeded by the		
13			transportation of nonpublic school students.		
14	2.	a.	The board of a school district that provides transportation to its students may		
15			contract with other local, state, or federal government entities for the joint

18			requirements otherwise imposed by law on schoolbuses, on school vehicles,		
19			and on schoolbus drivers when students are being transported.

21			qualify for state transportation aid under chapter 15.1-27. However, no		
22			payments may be made from state funds for any costs incurred as a result of		
23			a deviation from established schoolbus routes necessitated by a contract		
24			pursuant to this subsection.		
25	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-32-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
26	amended a	nd re	eenacted as follows:		
27	15.1-32-16. Transportation services - State reimbursement. If a student's				
28	individualized education program or services plan requires the provision of transportation				
29	services, the student's school district of residence shall provide the services by any reasonably				
30	prudent means, including a regularly scheduled schoolbus, public transit, commercial				
31	transportation, chartered or other contracted transportation, and transportation provided by the

- 1 student's parent or other responsible party. The school district is entitled to state
- 2 reimbursement for the provision of transportation services to the student. If transportation is
- 3 provided by a student's parent, the superintendent may reimburse the school district only for
- 4 mileage costs.
- 5 **SECTION 7. REPEAL.** Sections 15.1-27-26, 15.1-27-27, 15.1-27-28, 15.1-27-29,
- 6 15.1-27-30, and 15.1-27-31 of the North Dakota Century Code are repealed.
