HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3016

- 1 A concurrent resolution for the amendment of section 2 of article III of the Constitution of North
- 2 Dakota, relating to requiring a determination of the fiscal impact of an initiated measure.

3 STATEMENT OF INTENT

- 4 This measure requires an analysis of the fiscal impact of an initiative measure, requires
- 5 disclosure in the ballot title for the measure of a fiscal impact of one million dollars or more for a
- 6 calendar year.

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BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE

SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

- 9 That the following proposed amendment to section 2 of article III of the Constitution of
- 10 North Dakota is agreed to and must be submitted to the qualified electors of North Dakota at
- 11 the primary election to be held in 2004, in accordance with section 16 of article IV of the
- 12 Constitution of North Dakota.
- 13 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 2 of article III of the Constitution of North Dakota
- 14 is amended and reenacted as follows:
- **Section 2.** A petition to initiate or to refer a measure shall must be presented to the
- 16 secretary of state for approval as to form. A request for approval shall must be presented over
- 17 the names and signatures of twenty-five or more electors as sponsors, one of whom shall must
- 18 be designated as chairman of the sponsoring committee. The secretary of state shall approve
- 19 the petition for circulation if it is in proper form and contains the names and addresses of the
- 20 sponsors and the full text of the measure.
- 21 After the secretary of state approves for circulation a petition to initiate a measure, the
- 22 secretary of state shall notify the legislative council staff of the approval. The legislative council
- 23 staff shall request the state agency or department responsible for collecting or expending
- 24 revenues affected by the proposed initiated measure to prepare a fiscal analysis of the
- 25 proposed measure. If the secretary of state places the measure on the ballot and if the fiscal

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- 1 <u>analysis determines that the measure will have a fiscal impact of one million dollars or more for</u>
- 2 the first calendar year after the measure would be effective, the secretary of state shall include
- 3 within the ballot title a statement of the fiscal impact of the measure for the first calendar year
- 4 <u>after the measure would be effective.</u>
