## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4021

1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study changing the mission of the 2 State Hospital from one of caring for individuals with mental illness and individuals with drug 3 and alcohol addictions and develop legislation to change the role to a mission of caring for and 4 housing inmates with mental illness and drug and alcohol addictions and conducting offender 5 assessments, transferring the authority for the State Hospital facilities from the Department of 6 Human Services to the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, and requiring the 7 Department of Human Services to contract with mental health care providers and up to four 8 regional hospitals to provide for the care of individuals with mental illness and drug and alcohol 9 addictions. 10 WHEREAS, changes in clinical practices and service delivery systems have created a 11 need for new and different responses in caring for individuals with mental illness and drug and 12 alcohol addictions; and 13 WHEREAS, over the past decade, more community-based mental health treatment, 14 service, and support options have been developed to support an individual's recovery in or near 15 the individual's own community; and

WHEREAS, the State Hospital's total admissions have decreased from 1,734 patients in
1997 to a projected 808 patients in 2003, and of those 808 patients, 82 are projected to be
offenders who are being treated in the State Hospital's corrections rehabilitation and recovery
program; and

WHEREAS, the average daily population of the State Hospital has decreased from 228
patients in 1997 to a projected 160 patients in 2003, and of those 160 patients, 25 are projected
to be offenders who are being treated in the State Hospital's corrections rehabilitation and
recovery program; and

WHEREAS, a 2002 study of the operations and facilities of the Department of
Corrections and Rehabilitation projected that the number of inmates in the state's prison system

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1 will continue to grow by approximately 3 percent annually, resulting in an additional 415

2 offenders by 2012; and

WHEREAS, the 2002 study projected that the female population will grow even faster,
adding 84 inmates over the next 10 years, a 67 percent increase over the current population;
and

6 **WHEREAS**, the 2002 study indicated that for the Department of Corrections and

7 Rehabilitation to avoid a critical prison capacity shortfall, especially for the female offenders,

8 additional bed space is necessary; and

9 WHEREAS, of the inmates admitted in 2001, one-third of the male admissions and
10 one-fifth of the female admissions reported daily alcohol use prior to incarceration and over
11 one-third of the male admissions and one-half of the female admissions reported daily drug use
12 prior to incarceration; and

WHEREAS, of the inmates admitted in 2001, major mental health disorders, including
schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, and suicidal tendencies, were reported in 10.3 percent of males
and 14.1 percent of females, and depression was reported in 18.1 percent of males and
30.3 percent of females; and

WHEREAS, a change in the mission of the State Hospital may require constitutionalamendment;

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE
 20 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

21 That the Legislative Council study changing the mission of the State Hospital from one 22 of caring for individuals with mental illness and individuals with drug and alcohol addictions and 23 develop legislation to change the role to a mission of caring for and housing inmates with 24 mental illness and drug and alcohol addictions and conducting offender assessments. 25 transferring the authority for the State Hospital facilities from the Department of Human 26 Services to the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, and requiring the Department of 27 Human Services to contract with mental health care providers and up to four regional hospitals 28 to provide for the care of individuals with mental illness and drug and alcohol addictions; and 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and 30 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to

31 the Fifty-ninth Legislative Assembly.
