1	A concurrent resolution urging Congress to eliminate the estate tax.
2	WHEREAS, under tax relief legislation passed in 2001, the estate tax was temporarily
3	phased out, not permanently eliminated; and
4	WHEREAS, women and minorities are very often owners of small and medium-sized
5	businesses, and the estate tax prevents their children from reaping the rewards of a lifetime of
6	trying to make a better life; and
7	WHEREAS, farmers and other small business owners will face losing their farms and
8	businesses if the federal government resumes the heavy taxation of citizens at death; and
9	WHEREAS, employees suffer when they lose their jobs when small and medium-sized
10	businesses are liquidated to pay estate taxes and because high capital costs depress the
11	number of new businesses that could offer them a job; and
12	WHEREAS, if the estate tax had been repealed in 1996, over the next nine years it has
13	been estimated the United States economy would have averaged as much as \$11 billion per
14	year in extra output, and an average of 145,000 additional new jobs would have been created;
15	and
16	WHEREAS, the persistent uncertainty created by the estate tax sunset provision
17	prevents families and small businesses from taking advantage of the temporary repeal; and
18	WHEREAS, having repeatedly passed both the United States House of Representatives
19	and the United States Senate, elimination of the estate tax has wide bipartisan support;
20	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
21	OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
22	That the North Dakota Legislative Assembly urges the Congress of the United States to
23	eliminate the estate tax; and
24	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this
25	resolution to the chairman of the United States House of Representatives Ways and Means
