1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 19-18 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to experimental use permits; to amend and reenact section 4-35-06 of

3 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to restricted use pesticides; and to repeal section

4 4-35-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to experimental use permits.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 19-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 created and enacted as follows:

8	Exp	erimental use permits. Provided the state is authorized by the administrator of the		
9	environmental protection agency to issue experimental use permits, the commissioner may:			
10	<u>1.</u>	Issue an experimental use permit to a person applying for a permit if the		
11		commissioner determines that the applicant requires the permit to accumulate		
12		information necessary to register a pesticide use. An application for an		
13		experimental use permit may be filed at the time of or before or after an application		
14		for registration is filed.		
15	<u>2.</u>	Prescribe terms, conditions, and the period of time for use under the experimental		
16		use permit.		
17	<u>3.</u>	Revoke an experimental use permit, at any time, if the commissioner finds that its		
18		terms or conditions are being violated or that its term and conditions are		
19		inadequate to avoid unreasonable adverse effects to human health or the		
20		environment.		
21	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 4-35-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
22	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:		
23	4-35	5-06. Pesticide control board to administer chapter and adopt regulations.

	in ac	cordance with chapter 28-32 to implement this chapter. The rules may
	pres	cribe methods to be used in the application of pesticides. The rules may
	relat	e to the time, place, manner, methods, materials, and amounts and
	cond	centrations, in connection with the application of the pesticide, and may
	restr	ict or prohibit use of pesticides in designated areas during specified
	perio	ods of time and shall encompass all reasonable factors which the board
	deer	ns necessary to prevent damage or injury by drift or misapplication to:
	(1)	Plants, including forage plants, on adjacent or nearby lands.
	(2)	Wildlife in the adjoining or nearby areas.
	(3)	Fish and other aquatic life in waters in proximity to the area to be
		treated.
	(4)	Persons, animals, or beneficial insects.
	b. In ac	dopting rules, the board shall give consideration to pertinent research
	findi	ngs and recommendations of other agencies of this state, the federal
	gove	ernment, or other reliable sources.
2.	For the p	urpose of uniformity, the board may adopt restricted use classifications as
	determine	ed by the federal environmental protection agency. The board may also
	by rule de	etermine state restricted use pesticides for the state or designated areas
	within the	-state.
3.	The boar	d, in adopting rules under this chapter, shall prescribe standards and
	requireme	ents for the certification of applicators of pesticides. These standards and
	requireme	ents must relate to the use and handling of pesticides. In determining
	these sta	ndards and requirements, the board shall take into consideration
	standards	s and requirements prescribed by the environmental protection agency.
4. <u>3.</u>	Rules add	opted under this chapter may not permit any pesticide use which is
	prohibited	by the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act or regulations
	or orders	issued thereunder.

4		a. The collection, examination, and reporting of samples of pesticides.		
5		b. The safe handling, transportation, storage, display, distribution, and disposal		
6		of pesticides and their containers.		
7		c. The identification of pests under this chapter when the board finds particular		
8		organisms to be annoying or otherwise injurious or harmful to agriculture,		
9		health, and the environment.		
10	SEC	CTION 3. REPEAL. Section 4-35-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
