- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 11-19.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the confidentiality of photographs and video recordings.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 11-19.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 11-19.1-11. Coroner may perform autopsy Notice of results <u>- Confidentiality of</u>
- 7 **photographs and video recordings.** The coroner or the coroner's medical deputy, if the
- 8 coroner deems it necessary, may take custody of the dead body for the purpose of autopsy.
- 9 When the coroner does not deem an autopsy necessary, the sheriff and state's attorney may
- 10 direct an autopsy be performed. Upon the death of a child whose cause of death is suspected
- 11 by the child's parent or guardian or the coroner or the coroner's medical deputy to have been
- 12 the sudden infant death syndrome, the coroner or the coroner's medical deputy, after
- 13 consultation with the parent or guardian, shall take custody of the dead body and shall arrange
- 14 for the performance of the autopsy by a qualified pathologist, unless the county coroner, sheriff,
- 15 state's attorney, and the parent or guardian all agree that an autopsy is unnecessary. The
- 16 parents or guardian and the state health officer shall be promptly notified of the results of that
- 17 autopsy. Photographs or video recordings of an autopsy are confidential and may only be
- 18 provided to the decedent's immediate family, a medical school for use for educational
- 19 purposes, law enforcement agencies, or pursuant to a court order. For purposes of this
- 20 section, "immediate family" means the decedent's spouse, parent, child, or sibling.
