

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4023

1 A concurrent resolution urging the Congress to enact a Medicare prescription drug benefit.

2 **WHEREAS**, the use of prescription drugs improves the quality of care and helps
3 patients live healthier, longer, and more productive lives while keeping them out of more costly
4 acute care settings in the long term; and

5 **WHEREAS**, the increased use of new and improved prescription drugs has changed the
6 delivery of health care in the United States since Medicare was enacted, and while two-thirds of
7 the Medicare population has some form of prescription drug coverage, although many times it is
8 inadequate, one-third of Medicare beneficiaries have no coverage at all; and

9 **WHEREAS**, Congress did not enact a drug benefit in the Medicare program therefore,
10 the program is inadequate in providing the elderly and disabled the most appropriate drug
11 therapies, preventing the delivery of quality health care at an affordable cost; and

12 **WHEREAS**, the private sector provides affordable coverage by negotiating discounts on
13 drugs and meeting the needs of special populations with chronic diseases and those with
14 comorbidities through coordinating care with disease management, drug utilization review, and
15 patient education programs, all of which aid in ameliorating medical errors; and

16 **WHEREAS**, comprehensive reform of the Medicare program would utilize the
17 successful tools of the private sector in coordinating care for this population and use the
18 marketplace to foster competition among private plans, resulting in more choices of quality
19 coverage for seniors and the disabled while maintaining the financial sustainability of the
20 program; and

21 **WHEREAS**, Congress's inaction has failed to provide for comprehensive reform of
22 Medicare, encouraging states to use their own resources to ease the burden of their elderly and
23 disabled populations and effectively assume an unfunded, informal mandate; and

1 **WHEREAS**, in implementing state programs to assist the Medicare population, state
2 budgetary constraints can often result in requirements to restrict and limit the patients' access
3 to needed prescription drugs and enact anticompetitive price controls;

4 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE**
5 **HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:**

6 That the Fifty-eighth Legislative Assembly urges the Congress of the United States to
7 enact financially sustainable, voluntary, universal, and privately administered outpatient
8 prescription drug coverage as part of the federal Medicare program; and

9 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this
10 resolution to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives and the President of
11 the United States Senate and to each member of the North Dakota Congressional Delegation.
