- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 43-12.1-10 and a new
- 2 section to chapter 43-12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to transitional nurse
- 3 licensure and continuing education; to amend and reenact section 43-12.1-02, subsection 2 of
- 4 section 43-12.1-04, and sections 43-12.1-08 and 43-12.1-09 of the North Dakota Century
- 5 Code, relating to nursing education programs; and to provide for application.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

9 43-12.1-02. Definitions. In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise
10 requires:

- "Advanced practice registered nurse" means a person who holds a current license
   to practice in this state as an advanced practice registered nurse and either has a
   graduate degree with a nursing focus or has completed the educational
   requirements in effect when the person was initially licensed.
- 15 2. "Board" means the North Dakota board of nursing.
- 3. "Licensed practical nurse" means a person who holds a current license to practice
   in this state as a licensed practical nurse and either has an associate degree with
   a major in nursing or has completed the educational requirements in effect when
   the person was initially licensed.
- "Nurse" means any person currently licensed as an advanced practice registered
   nurse, registered nurse, or licensed practical nurse.
- S. "Nursing" means the performance of acts utilizing specialized knowledge, skills,
  and abilities for people in a variety of settings. Nursing includes the following acts,

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	which may not be deemed to include acts of medical diagnosis or treatment or the		
	practice of medicine as defined in chapter 43-17:		
	a. The maintenance of health and prevention of illness.		
	b. Diagnosing human responses to actual or potential health problems.		
	c. Providing supportive and restorative care and nursing treatment, medication		
	administration, health counseling and teaching, case finding and referral of		
	persons who are ill, injured, or experiencing changes in the normal health		
	processes.		
	d. Administration, teaching, supervision, delegation, and evaluation of health		
	and nursing practices.		
	e. Collaboration with other health care professionals in the implementation of the		
	total health care regimen and execution of the health care regimen prescribed		
	by a health care practitioner licensed under title 43.		
6.	"Prescriptive practices" means assessing the need for drugs, immunizing agents,		
	or devices and writing a prescription to be filled by a licensed pharmacist.		
7.	"Registered nurse" means a person who holds a current license to practice in this		
	state as a registered nurse and either has a baccalaureate degree with a major in		
	nursing or has completed the educational requirements in effect when the person		
	was initially licensed.		
8.	"Specialty practice registered nurse" means a person who holds a current license		
	to practice in this state as a specialty practice registered nurse and has the		
	educational preparation and national certification within a defined area of nursing		
	practice.		
9.	"Transitional practical nurse license" means a license issued by the board to a		
	person who meets all of the requirements for licensure by endorsement as a		
	licensed practical nurse, except the educational requirements.		
10.	"Transitional registered nurse license" means a license issued by the board to a		
	person who meets all of the requirements for licensure by endorsement as a		
	registered nurse, except the educational requirements.

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111."Unlicensed assistive person" means an assistant to the nurse who regardless of2title is authorized by the board to perform nursing interventions delegated and3supervised by a licensed nurse.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 43-12.1-04 of the North Dakota
Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- Students Upon notification of the board, a student practicing nursing as a part of a
   board approved nursing education program preparing for initial or advanced
   licensure as a registered nurse or licensed practical nurse which is located in an
   institution of higher education that offers transferable credit.
- SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
   amended and reenacted as follows:

43-12.1-08. Powers and duties of the board. The board shall regulate the practice of nursing to assure that qualified competent practitioners and high quality standards are available. Regulation of the profession of nursing must ensure that no person may practice or offer to practice nursing or use titles of advanced practice registered nurse, specialty practice registered nurse, registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, or unlicensed assistive person, or titles of a similar nature which denote the practice of nursing to the general public unless licensed or registered as provided in this chapter. The board shall:

- Enforce the provisions of this chapter. The board has all of the duties, powers,
   and authority specifically granted by and necessary for the enforcement of this
   chapter.
- 22 2. Adopt rules necessary to administer this chapter.
- Appoint and employ a qualified registered nurse to serve as executive director and
  approve any additional staff positions necessary to administer this chapter.
- 4. Establish fees and receive all moneys collected under this chapter and authorize
  all expenditures necessary to conduct the business of the board. Any balance of
  fees after payment of expenditures must be used to administer this chapter.
- 28 5. Establish qualifications for nursing licensure and registration.
- 29 6. Establish standards for nursing education and practice and:
- a. Collaborate and consult with the appropriate nursing organizations and other
   affected parties in the establishment of the standards; and

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1		b. Consult with the medical profession in the establishment of prescriptive
2		practice standards for advanced practice registered nurses. Prescriptive
3		practices must be consistent with the scope of practice of the advanced
4		practice registered nurse and include evidence of a collaborative agreement
5		with a licensed physician.
6	7.	Periodically review and approve nursing education programs leading to initial or
7		advanced licensure. The board may not restrict the offering in this state of nursing
8		programs accredited by the national league for nursing accrediting commission,
9		incorporated, or the commission on collegiate nursing education if the programs
10		meet the same or equivalent education standards required by the board for North
11		Dakota programs.
12	8.	License and register applicants and renew and reinstate licenses and registrations.
13	9.	Establish standards for assessing the competence of licensees and registrants
14		continuing in or returning to practice.
15	10.	Collect and analyze data regarding nursing education, nursing practice, and
16		nursing resources.
17	11.	Issue limited licenses to individuals requiring accommodation to practice nursing.
18	12.	Establish confidential programs for the rehabilitation of nurses with workplace
19		impairments.
20	13.	Discipline applicants, licensees, and registrants for violating this chapter.
21	14.	Establish a nursing student loan program funded by license fees to encourage
22		persons to enter and advance in the nursing profession.
23	15.	Establish a registry of persons licensed or registered by the board.
24	16.	Collaborate and consult with the North Dakota nurses association, North Dakota
25		licensed practical nurses association, and other nursing specialty groups prior to
26		the adoption of rules.
27	17.	Report annually to the governor and nursing profession regarding the regulation of
28		nursing in the state.
29	18.	Conduct and support projects pertaining to nursing education and practice.

1	19.	Not	ify the board of pharmacy on an annual basis, or more frequent basis if
2		nec	essary, of advanced practice registered nurses authorized to write
3		pre	scriptions.
4	20.	Add	opt rules to allow nurses licensed by another state to receive short-term clinical
5		edu	cation in North Dakota health care facilities.

1		3.	If an applicant for licensure by endorsement does not meet the educational		
2			requirements for the appropriate level of licensure as established by the board, a		
3			transitional license may be issued. A transitional license may be issued and		
4			renewed according to board rules. Renewal requires proof of progression towards		
5			meeting the academic requirements or thirty hours of continuing education.		
6		<del>4.</del>	An applicant for licensure as an advanced practice registered nurse shall:		
7			a. Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by the		
8			board;		
9			b. Submit evidence of appropriate education and current certification in an		
10			advanced nursing role by a national nursing organization meeting criteria as		
11			established by the board; and		
12			c. Possess or show evidence of application for a current unencumbered		
13			registered nurse license.		
14	<del>5.</del>	<u>4.</u>	An applicant for licensure as an advanced practice registered nurse who		
15			completed an advanced nursing education program and was licensed or certified		
16			in advanced practice by another state before January 1, 2001, or who completed		
17			an advanced nursing education program and was licensed or certified as a		
18			women's health care nurse practitioner by another state before January 1, 2007,		
19			may apply for and receive an advanced practice license if that person meets the		
20			requirements that were in place in this state at the time the applicant qualified for		
21			initial advanced practice licensure in that state.

7	Code is created	and enacted as follows:		
8	<u>The</u>	board shall issue a licensed practical nurse license or a registered nurse		
9	license to each individual who holds a license as a transitional practical nurse or a			
10	tran	sitional registered nurse on August 1, 2003. A newly issued license under this		
11	sect	ion replaces the transitional license.		
12	SECTIO	<b>16.</b> A new section to chapter 43-12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
13	created and ena	cted as follows:		
14	<u>Continui</u>	ng education requirements. The board shall adopt rules requiring every		
15	nurse licensed in	the state to fulfill continuing education requirements. Before the board may		
16	renew a license, the licensee shall submit evidence to the board establishing that all continuing			
17	education require	ements prescribed by the rules adopted by the board have been met.		
18	SECTIO	<b>N 7. APPLICATION.</b> The licensure requirements of section 6 of this Act are		
19	effective beginni	ng with the 2005 licensure year.
