1 A concurrent resolution urging Congress to enact legislation for the economic recovery of North 2 Dakota's Missouri River corridor. 3 WHEREAS, the 11 counties comprising the Missouri River corridor in North Dakota lost 4 more than 500,000 acres of valuable river bottomlands as a result of construction of the 5 Missouri River reservoirs under the federal Flood Control Act of 1944, causing an annual loss of 6 millions of dollars in economic gross product and an additional annual loss in personal income 7 as well as other serious impacts to individuals, political subdivisions, and North Dakota's Indian 8 Nations; and 9 WHEREAS, operation of the Pick-Sloan Missouri River dams has provided great 10 benefits to the downstream states but relatively few benefits to the 11 counties directly affected 11 by the projects; and 12 WHEREAS, counties affected by the Pick-Sloan Missouri River dams have been 13 working diligently to bring about some economic recovery to help alleviate the losses caused by 14 the project during the last 50 years; and 15 WHEREAS, it has been determined that the water and land resources of the 11 counties are key to the economic growth of these counties; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the North Dakota Water User's Association supports a proposed North 18 Dakota Missouri River Corridor Economy Recovery Act under which the federal government 19 would appropriate funds to the Bank of North Dakota over a 10-year period, to be used to 20 rebuild infrastructure lost over the 50-year period through inundation caused by the main stem 21 Missouri River dams; and 22 WHEREAS, the North Dakota Irrigation Caucus is in the early stages of revising a 23 strategic plan, Irrigation 2020, to develop, strengthen, and expand irrigation in North Dakota;

WHEREAS, if the federal government appropriated \$600 million dollars to the Bank of
North Dakota for a period of 10 years, the Bank could invest this money and use the interest to
help the corridor counties to rebuild their infrastructure that was destroyed by construction of
the Pick-Sloan Missouri River dams;
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
That the Fifty-eighth Legislative Assembly urges the Congress of the United States to
enact legislation for the economic recovery of North Dakota's Missouri River corridor; and
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this
resolution to the Governor, the United States Secretary of the Interior, and each member of the
North Dakota Congressional Delegation.
