

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3052

1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study school district data collection
2 and reporting requirements.

3 **WHEREAS**, school districts are required to collect and submit data to a variety of
4 entities, including the superintendent of public instruction, the education standards and
5 practices board, the state board for vocational and technical education, and the educational
6 technology council; and

7 **WHEREAS**, the data that is to be collected and submitted affects students, staff, school
8 operations, and specific programs; and

9 **WHEREAS**, data collection and submission requirements are expected to increase
10 because of new federal and state education statutes and rules; and

11 **WHEREAS**, some of the data that is required is duplicative and some of the data that is
12 required is of little value; and

13 **WHEREAS**, electronic reporting systems do not always function in a manner that allows
14 for maximum efficiency in data collection and reporting;

15 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES**
16 **OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:**

17 That the Legislative Council study school district data collection and reporting
18 requirements, including the complexity of the requirements, the ability of school districts to
19 comply with the requirements, and methods for ensuring efficiency in the data collection and
20 reporting process; and

21 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Legislative Council report its findings and
22 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
23 the Fifty-ninth Legislative Assembly.
