- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the judicial branch;
- 2 and to amend and reenact sections 27-02-02 and 27-05-03 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 3 relating to salaries of supreme and district court judges.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. T	he funds provided in this section, or so much of the	
6	funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state		
7	treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and		
8	other income, to the judicial branch for the purpose of defraying the expenses of its various		
9	divisions, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005, as follows:

12	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There are appropriated any funds received by the		
13	supreme court, district courts, and judicial conduct commission and disciplinary board, not		
14	otherwise appropriated, pursuant to federal acts and private gifts, grants, and donations for the		
15	purpose as designated in the federal acts or private gifts, grants, and donations for the period		
16	beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.		
17	SECTION 3. TRANSFERS. The director of the office of management and budget and		
18	the state treasurer shall make such transfers of funds between line items of appropriation for		
19	the judicial branch of government as may be requested by the supreme court upon a finding by		
20	the court that the nature of the duties of the court and its staff requires the transfers to carry on		
21	properly the functions of the judicial branch of government.		
22	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 27-02-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
23	amended and reenacted as follows:		
24	27-02-02. Salaries of judges of supreme court. The annual salary of each judge of		
25	the supreme court is ninety-two one hundred two thousand two hundred eighty-nine ninety-six		
26	dollars through June 30, 2002 2004, and ninety-nine one hundred four thousand one hundred		
27	twenty-two thirty-eight dollars thereafter. The chief justice of the supreme court is entitled to		
28	receive an additional two thousand five nine hundred sixty-nine eighty-six dollars per annum		
29	through June 30, <del>2002</del> <u>2004</u> , and <del>two</del> <u>three</u> thousand <del>eight hundred ninety-nine</del> <u>forty-six</u> dollars		
30	per annum thereafter.		

**SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 27-05-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

27-05-03. Salaries and expenses of district judges. The annual salary of each district judge is eighty four ninety-three thousand seven three hundred sixty-five ninety-one dollars through June 30, 2002 2004, and ninety ninety-six thousand six one hundred seventy one ninety-three dollars thereafter. Each district judge is entitled to travel expenses including mileage and subsistence while engaged in the discharge of official duties outside the city in which the judge's chambers are located. The salary and expenses are payable monthly in the manner provided by law. A presiding judge of a judicial district is entitled to receive an additional one two thousand nine seven hundred eighty nine fifty-two dollars per annum, through June 30, 2002 2004, and two thousand six eight hundred seventy two thirty-five dollars thereafter.
