- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 39-06.2 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to furnishing driving record information and to records of imminent
- 3 hazard disqualification of commercial drivers; and to amend and reenact subsection 67 of

4 section 39-01-01 and sections 39-06.2-02 and 39-06.2-10 of the North Dakota Century Code,

5 relating to definitions and disqualification of commercial motor vehicle operators.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 39-06.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
created and enacted as follows:

9 Driving record information to be furnished. Notwithstanding any other provision of
 10 law, the director shall furnish full information regarding the driving record of a person who has

11 been issued a commercial driver's license to an employer or prospective employer upon

- 12 request and payment of a fee of three dollars.
- SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 39-06.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 created and enacted as follows:

15 Imminent hazard disgualification - Records. A disgualification imposed in

16 accordance with the provisions of 49 CFR part 383.52 relating to notification from the federal

17 motor carrier safety administration that the driver is disqualified from driving a commercial motor

- 18 vehicle and is determined to constitute an imminent hazard becomes a part of the driver's
- 19 record maintained by the director.
- SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 67 of section 39-01-01 of the North Dakota
 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 22 67. "Schoolbus" means any <u>a commercial</u> motor vehicle owned by a public or
 23 governmental agency and operated for the transportation of children to or from
 24 school or to or from school-related activities, or privately owned and operated for

1 compensation for the transportation of children to or from school or to or from 2 school related activities used to transport preprimary, primary, or secondary school 3 students from home to school, from school to home, or to and from 4 school-sponsored events. Schoolbus does not include a bus used as a common 5 carrier. 6 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06.2-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows: 8 **39-06.2-02.** Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the context or subject matter 9 otherwise requires: 10 1. "Alcohol" means any substance containing any form of alcohol, including ethanol, 11 methanol, propanol, and isopropanol. 12 2. "Alcohol concentration" means: 13 The number of grams of alcohol per one hundred milliliters of blood; a. 14 b. The number of grams of alcohol per two hundred ten liters of breath; or 15 c. The number of grams of alcohol per sixty-seven milliliters of urine. 16 3. "Commercial driver's instruction permit" means a permit issued under subsection 4 17 of section 39-06.2-07. 18 "Commercial driver's license" means a license issued under this chapter which 4. 19 authorizes an individual to drive a class of commercial motor vehicle. 20 5. "Commercial driver's license information system" means the information system 21 established under the Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act to serve as a 22 clearinghouse for locating information related to the licensing and identification of 23 commercial motor vehicle drivers. 24 6. "Commercial motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle or combination of motor 25 vehicles designed or used to transport passengers or property: 26 If the gross combination weight rating is twenty-six thousand one pounds a. 27 [11794 kilograms] or more provided the towed unit has a gross vehicle weight 28 rating of more than ten thousand pounds [4536 kilograms]; 29 b. If the vehicle has a gross vehicle weight rating of more than twenty-six 30 thousand pounds [11793.40 kilograms] or such lesser rating as determined by 31 federal regulation;

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- If any of the above violations occurred while transporting a hazardous material
 required to be placarded, the person is disqualified for a period of not less than
 three years.
- A person is disqualified for life if convicted of two or more violations of any of the
 offenses specified in subsection 1, or any combination of those offenses, arising
 from two or more separate incidents. Only offenses committed after July 1, 1989,
 may be considered in applying this subsection.
- 8 3. The director may adopt rules under section 39-06.2-14, establishing guidelines,
 9 including conditions, under which a disqualification for life under subsection
 10 subsections 2, 8, 10, and 12 may be reduced to a period of not less than ten years.
- A person is disqualified from driving a commercial motor vehicle for life who uses a
 commercial motor vehicle in the commission of any felony involving the
 manufacture, distribution, or dispensing of a controlled substance, or possession
 with intent to manufacture, distribute, or dispense a controlled substance.
- 5. A person is disqualified from driving a commercial motor vehicle for a period of not
 less than sixty days if convicted of two serious traffic violations, or one hundred
 twenty days if convicted of three serious traffic violations, committed in a
 commercial motor vehicle arising from separate incidents occurring within a
 three-year period.
- 20 6. Disqualification for railroad-highway grade crossing violation:
- 21a.A driver who is convicted of driving a commercial motor vehicle in violation of22a federal, state, or local law or regulation pertaining to any one of the following23six offenses at a railroad-highway grade crossing is disqualified for the period24of time specified in subdivision b:
 - For drivers who are not required to always stop, failing to slow down and check that the tracks are clear of an approaching train;
 - (2) For drivers who are not required to always stop, failing to stop before reaching the crossing, if the tracks are not clear;
 - (3) For drivers who are always required to stop, failing to stop before driving onto the crossing;
