## ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1092

Introduced by

(At the request of the Attorney General)

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 11-18, a new subsection to

- 2 section 23-02.1-28, and three new sections to chapter 44-04 of the North Dakota Century
- 3 Code, relating to redaction of social security numbers by the county recorder, the confidentiality
- 4 of social security numbers, the confidentiality of client files at the University of North Dakota
- 5 school of law, and the confidentiality of records of fire department and rural fire protection

6 districts; and to amend and reenact section 20.1-03-35, subsection 8 of section 23-02.1-19,

7 section 23-02.1-27, subsection 6 of section 41-09-73, section 43-50-04, subsection 2 of section

8 44-04-18.1, subsection 6 of section 44-04-20, and subsection 1 of section 44-04-21.1 of the

- 9 North Dakota Century Code, relating to confidentiality of social security numbers, notice of
- 10 emergency or special meetings, and release of certain information received by the attorney
- 11 general when preparing open records and meetings opinions.

## 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 11-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is
created and enacted as follows:

15	<u>Filir</u>	ng or recording documents with recorder - Social security numbers.
16	<u>1.</u>	A document that includes a social security number may not be filed or recorded
17		with the recorder unless a law requires the social security number to be in the
18		document in order to be filed or recorded. A document that is required to contain a
19		social security number may be recorded in the real estate records with the social
20		security number redacted.
21	<u>2.</u>	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, when a copy of a document that
22		includes a social security number is requested, the recorder is not required to
23		redact the social security number unless the document was filed or recorded with
24		the recorder after the effective date of this Act.

1	<u>3.</u>	A document that must include a social security number under chapters 14-03 and
2		23-02.1 may be processed and recorded under those chapters; however, the
3		social security number is confidential and must be redacted before a copy or
4		certified copy may be provided to the public.
5	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-03-35 of the North Dakota Century Code is
6	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:
7	20.1	-03-35. Social security number to be furnished. The social security number of
8	an applican	t for any license or permit issued under this chapter must be recorded on the
9	application	unless the applicant is a foreign national to whom no social security number has
10	been issued	d. A social security number recorded under this section is exempt from section
11	44-04-18 ar	nd section 6 of article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota confidential.
12	SEC	CTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 8 of section 23-02.1-19 of the North Dakota
13	Century Co	de is amended and reenacted as follows:
14	8.	Each death certificate must include the social security number of the decedent, if
15		the information is available. A social security number included on a death
16		certificate is exempt from section 44-04-18 and section 6 of article XI of the
17		Constitution of North Dakota confidential.
18	SEC	CTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 23-02.1-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is
19	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:
20	23-0	<b>2.1-27.</b> Disclosure of records. The state registrar, and local registrars, may
21	supervise a	nd regulate physical access to vital records to protect vital records from loss,
22	mutilation, c	or destruction and to prevent improper disclosure of records that are confidential.
23	Information	relating to the birth or fetal death of a child to a woman who was not married to the
24	child's fathe	r when the child was conceived or born may be disclosed only to the child's
25	guardian, to	the person individual to whom the record relates if that person individual is at least
26	eighteen ye	ars old, to the parent of the child, or upon order of a court of competent jurisdiction.
27	Information	in vital records indicating cause of death may not be disclosed except to a relative
28	or personal	representative of the deceased, to the attorney or the agent of a relative or
29	personal rep	presentative of the deceased, to the child fatality review panel, or upon order of a
30	court of con	npetent jurisdiction. An individual's social security number contained in vital records
31	may not be	disclosed except to the individual to whom it pertains, that individual's lawful agent

- 1 or guardian, or by order of a court. Only a certified copy of a certificate or record may be
- 2 provided to the public.
- 3 SECTION 5. A new subsection to section 23-02.1-28 of the North Dakota Century
  4 Code is created and enacted as follows:
- A certified copy may not disclose an individual's social security number unless the
  copy is being provided to the individual to whom it pertains, that individual's lawful
  agent or guardian, or by order of a court.
- 8 **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 6 of section 41-09-73 of the North Dakota 9 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 6. Effective January 1, 2002, any Any social security number or federal tax
- 11 identification number submitted under subdivision e of subsection 1 is not a public
- 12 record and may not be disclosed as part of any search under section 41-09-94 or
- 13 41-09-96 or as part of a copy of the record. <u>A debtor's social security number or</u>
- federal tax identification number may be filed only in the filing office with the central
   indexing system and may not be recorded in the real property records.
- 16 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-50-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is

17 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 43-50-04. Social security number not public record Confidential. A social
  security number provided under this chapter is exempt from section 44-04-18 and section 6 of
  article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota confidential.
- SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 44-04-18.1 of the North Dakota
   Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 23 Except as otherwise specifically provided by law, personal information regarding a 2. 24 public employee contained in an employee's personnel record or given to the state 25 or a political subdivision by the employee in the course of employment is exempt. 26 As used in this section, "personal information" means a person's home address; 27 home telephone number; photograph; medical information; motor vehicle 28 operator's identification number; social security number; payroll deduction 29 information; the name, address, telephone number, and date of birth, and social 30 security number of any dependent or emergency contact; any credit, debit, or

3	SECTIO	N 9. A new section to chapter 44-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4	created and ena	cted as follows:
5	<u>Social s</u>	ecurity numbers - Confidential.
6	<u>1. Soc</u>	ial security numbers in the possession of a public entity are confidential.
7	Hov	vever, social security numbers may be released as authorized in this section or
8	by c	other state or federal law.
9	<u>2. A so</u>	ocial security number may be released:
10	<u>a.</u>	For purposes of participation in retirement or other employment benefits
11		programs; or
12	<u>b.</u>	As authorized by the individual to whom the social security number is
13		assigned, that individual's lawful agent or guardian, or by order of a court.
14	SECTIO	N 10. A new section to chapter 44-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
15	created and ena	cted as follows:
16	<u>Client fil</u>	les at the university of North Dakota school of law - Confidential.
17	Information in th	e files of private clients receiving legal services through the clinical education
18	program of the u	iniversity of North Dakota school of law is confidential unless the information
19	has been reques	sted and is properly obtainable through applicable discovery rules.
20	SECTIO	N 11. A new section to chapter 44-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
21	created and ena	cted as follows:
22	<u>Records</u>	of fire departments and rural fire protection districts confidential.
23	<u>1. a.</u>	An investigation record of a fire department or a rural fire protection district is
24		confidential until the investigation:
25		(1) Is closed and not referred for further criminal investigation or
26		prosecution; or
27		(2) <u>The criminal investigation is no longer active under section 44-04-18.7.</u>
28	<u>b.</u>	This subsection does not restrict the release of the name and identifiable
29		biographical information of a child under section 12.1-35-03.
30	<u>2. Sta</u>	ndard operating procedures written for emergency response, prefire action
31	plar	ns, plans of a building, pipeline, electrical system, or any other infrastructure

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1		plan in the hands of a fire department or rural fire protection district are exempt			
2		from section 44-04-18.			
3	<u>3.</u>	Individually identifiable health information obtained by a fire department or rural fire			
4		protection district in the course of an investigation is confidential.			
5	SEC	CTION 12. AMENDMENT. Subsection 6 of section 44-04-20 of the North Dakota			
6	Century Co	de is amended and reenacted as follows:			
7	6.	In the event of emergency or special meetings of a governing body, the person			
8		calling such a meeting shall also notify the public entity's official newspaper, if any,			
9		and any representatives of the news media which have requested to be so notified			
10		of such special or emergency meetings, of the time, place, date, and topics to be			
11		considered at the same time as such governing body's members are notified.			
12		Topics that may be considered at an emergency or special meeting are limited to			
13		those included in the notice to the media.			
14	SEC	CTION 13. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 44-04-21.1 of the North Dakota			
15	Century Co	de is amended and reenacted as follows:			
16	1.	Any interested person may request an attorney general's opinion to review a			
17		written denial of a request for records under section 44-04-18, a denial of access			
18		to a meeting under section 44-04-19, or other alleged violation of section 44-04-18,			
19		44-04-19, 44-04-19.2, 44-04-20, or 44-04-21 by any public entity other than the			
20		legislative assembly or any committee thereof. A request made under this section			
21		must be made within thirty days of the alleged violation. In preparing an opinion			
22		under this section, the attorney general has discretion to obtain and review a			
23		recording made under section 44-04-19.2. The attorney general may request and			
24		obtain information claimed to be exempt or confidential for the purpose of			
25		determining whether the information is exempt or confidential. Any such			
26		information may not be released by the attorney general and may be returned to			
27		the provider of the information. The attorney general shall issue to the public entity			
28		involved an opinion on the alleged violation unless the request is withdrawn by the			
29		person requesting the opinion or a civil action has been filed involving the possible			
30		violation. If the request pertains to a public entity as defined in subdivision c of			

subsection 12 of section 44-04-17.1, the opinion must be issued to the public entity

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- 1 providing the public funds. In any opinion issued under this section, the attorney
- 2 general shall base the opinion on the facts given by the public entity.
