- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 39-24-09 and 39-24-11 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to snowmobile operation within the right of way of an interstate highway;
- 3 to provide a penalty; and to declare an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

39-24-09. Rules for operation of snowmobiles.

- No person may operate a snowmobile upon the roadway, shoulder, or inside bank
 or slope of any road, street, or highway in this state except as provided pursuant to
 this chapter. No snowmobile may be operated at any time within the right of way
 of any interstate highway within this state except for emergency purposes as
 provided in this section.
- A snowmobile may make a direct crossing of a <u>non-interstate</u> street or highway
 provided:
- a. The crossing is made at an angle of approximately ninety degrees to the
 direction of the highway and at a place where no obstruction prevents a quick
 and safe crossing;
- b. The snowmobile is brought to a complete stop before crossing the shoulder or
 main traveled way of the highway;
- 20 c. The driver yields the right of way to all oncoming traffic which constitutes an
 21 immediate hazard; and
- d. In crossing a divided highway, the crossing is made only at an intersection of
 such highway with another public street or highway.

1	3.	No snowmobile may be operated unless it is equipped with at least one headlamp,
2		one taillamp, and brakes, all in working order, which conform to standards
3		prescribed by rule of the director pursuant to the authority vested in the director by
4		this code and this chapter.
5	4.	The emergency conditions under which a snowmobile may be operated other than
6		as provided by this chapter must be such as to render the use of an automobile
7		impractical under such conditions at such period of time and location.
8	5.	It is unlawful for any person to drive or operate any snowmobile in the following
9		ways which are declared to be unsafe and a public nuisance:
10		a. At a rate of speed greater than reasonable or proper under all the surrounding
11		circumstances.
12		b. In a careless, reckless, or negligent manner so as to endanger the person or
13		property of another or to cause injury or damage to such person or property.
14		c. While under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a drug as defined in section
15		39-24.1-01, or a combination thereof.
16		d. Without a lighted headlamp and taillamp when required for safety.
17		e. In any tree nursery or planting in a manner which damages or destroys
18		growing stock.
19		f. Without a manufacturer-installed or equivalent muffler in good working order
20		and connected to the snowmobile exhaust system.
21		g. Upon any private land where the private land is posted by the owner or tenant
22		prohibiting trespassing. The name of the person posting the land must
23		appear on each sign in legible characters. The posted signs must be
24		readable from the outside of the land and must be placed conspicuously at a
25		distance of not more than eight hundred eighty yards [804.68 meters] apart,
26		provided further that as to land entirely enclosed by a fence or other
27		enclosure, posting of signs at or on all gates through the fence or enclosure
28		constitutes a posting of all the enclosed lands.
29	6.	It is unlawful for any person to operate a snowmobile pursuant to chapter 39-24
30		without having in possession a valid driver's license or permit, except as provided
31		by section 39-24-09.1.

- 7. When snowmobiles are operated within the right of way of any road, street, or
 highway of this state pursuant to this chapter, during times or conditions that
 warrant the use of lights, such snowmobiles shall travel in the same direction as
 the direction of motor vehicles traveling on the side of the roadway immediately
 adjacent to the side of the right of way traveled by the snowmobile.
- 8. It is unlawful for any person to operate a snowmobile within a highway right of way
 as defined in subsection 38 of section 24-01-01.1 between April first and
 November first of any year.

 9. No snowmobile may be operated at any time within the right of way of any highway
 10 within this state while towing a sled, skid, or other vehicle, unless the sled, skid, or
 11 other vehicle is connected to the snowmobile by a hinged swivel and secure hitch.
- 12 10. No person under the age of eighteen years may operate, ride, or otherwise be
 13 propelled on a snowmobile unless the person wears a safety helmet meeting
 14 United States department of transportation standards.
- 15 11. A person may not operate a snowmobile, and an owner of a snowmobile may not 16 knowingly permit the snowmobile to be operated, upon any property maintained, 17 leased, or owned by the state parks and recreation department to which the public 18 has a right of access for snowmobile or other vehicular use, without a policy of 19 liability insurance which insures the person named, and any person using the 20 snowmobile with the express or implied permission of the person named, against 21 loss from the liability imposed by law for damages arising out of the ownership, 22 maintenance, or use of the snowmobile within this state, subject to the following 23 limits, exclusive of interest and costs, with respect to each snowmobile: 24 twenty-five thousand dollars because of bodily injury to or death of one person in 25 any one accident and, subject to the limit for one person, fifty thousand dollars 26 because of bodily injury to or death of two or more persons in any one accident, 27 and twenty-five thousand dollars because of injury to or destruction of property of 28 others in any one accident. Upon request of a law enforcement officer, a person 29 operating a snowmobile shall provide proof of liability insurance to that officer 30 within twenty days.

1	<u>12.</u>	A snowmobile may not be operated within the right of way of any interstate
2		highway within this state except:
3		a. For emergency purposes; or
4		b. Across an interstate highway on an overpass or underpass, except where
5		otherwise prohibited by law or by signing, provided the snowmobile crosses
6		on the extreme right side of the overpass or underpass.
7	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is
8	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:
9	39-2	24-11. Penalties. Any person who violates subsection 12 of section 39-24-09 must
10	be assesse	d a fee of one hundred dollars. Any person who violates subdivision b or g of
11	subsection	5 of section 39-24-09 is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. Any person who violates
12	subdivision	c of subsection 5 of section 39-24-09 is guilty of an infraction or a class B
13	misdemear	or as determined by section 39-24.1-07. Any person who violates subsection 11 of
14	section 39-	24-09 is guilty of a class B misdemeanor and must be assessed a fine of at least
15	one hundre	d dollars. Any person who violates any other provision of section 39-24-09 must be
16	assessed a	fee of twenty dollars. Any person, unless specifically exempted, who fails to
17	register as	required by section 39-24-02 must be assessed a fee of fifty dollars. If the person
18	provides pr	oof of registration after the violation, the fee may be reduced by one-half. Any
19	person who	violates any other provision of this chapter for which a specific penalty is not
20	provided m	ust be assessed a fee of ten dollars.
21	SEC	CTION 3. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
