- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-18 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to teacher qualifications; to amend and reenact sections 15.1-18-02 and
- 3 15.1-18-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to teacher qualifications; and to provide
- 4 an effective date.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Definitions. For purposes of this chapter:

- 1. "Instruct in a self-contained classroom" means a teacher conducts all instruction of the grade-level curriculum in a single classroom setting. The instruction may involve more than one grade level if the grade levels are combined into the single classroom setting.
- 2. "Middle-level or junior high school setting" means instruction of students in grades five through eight but does not include instruction in a self-contained classroom.
- **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-18-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-18-02. Kindergarten through grade eight - Teacher qualifications – Exceptions.
