Today, February 11, 2003, an event will take place on the campus of the University of North Dakota in Grand Forks that epitomizes the academic tradition of this great university. The Faculty Lecture Series was initiated in 1954, the first year of the presidency of Dr. George Starcher. It continued through 1988 and then lapsed until an ad hoc committee of UND's Chester Fritz Distinguished Professors began meeting in 1997 to revive the series.

The Faculty Lecture Series seeks to cultivate a stronger academic atmosphere on the University of North Dakota campus by showcasing the scholarly lives of several faculty selected across the disciplines. The faculty are typically scholars of national and international reputation and the lectures aim to present with some depth and rigor the scholarly questions and goals of each individual. In presenting the products of their scholarship, the Lecturers share with students and colleagues the enthusiasm and dedication that sustains their creative efforts.

About 150 faculty have participated in the series and the breadth and diversity of scholarship on the campus is reflected in a sampling of titles. Starting with the first lecture, "From Viking Ships to Kon-Tiki," topics have included, "I'm Not Interested in Love Poetry: A Feminist Discovers Elizabeth Barrett Browning," "The Politics of Affluence," "Problems in Achieving Sustained Economic Progress," "The Continuing Search for Energy Fuels," and today's lecture, "Of Mice and Men," offered by a professor of microbiology and immunology.

We congratulate the University of North Dakota and especially this year's lecturers: Dr. Scott Lowe, Professor of Philosophy and Religion, Dr. John Ettling, Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs and Professor of History, Dr. Sandra Donaldson, Professor of English and Womens Studies, Dr. Roger Melvold, Professor and Chair of Microbiology and Immunology, and Dr. David Lambeth, Professor of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology.

We thank them for their dedication to their disciplines, for their service to the State of North Dakota, and for their contributions to the breadth of scholarship and the depth of learning at the University of North Dakota.
