SB 2309: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 4 of section 65-04-33 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to exempting townships from penalties for failing to furnish workers' compensation payroll reports.

Sens. Every, Erbele, Fairfield and Reps. Gulleson, Zaiser introduced:

SB 2310: A BILL for an Act to provide for wind turbine siting requirements and wind energy development contract provisions.
