SCR 4022: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study proposed legislation permitting the Game and Fish Department to coordinate with game and fish programs conducted by the tribal governments of the federally recognized Indian tribes in North Dakota.

Was read the first time and referred to the Natural Resources Committee.

Sens. Stenehjem, Holmberg, J. Lee and Reps. Berg, Devlin, Price introduced:

SCR 4023: A concurrent resolution urging the Congress to enact a Medicare prescription drug benefit.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

Sens. Fairfield, Nething and Reps. Hanson, Headland, Kroeber, Pollert introduced:

SCR 4024: A concurrent resolution celebrating the World Series victory of Darin Erstad as a member of the California Angels baseball team.

Was read the first time and referred to the Agriculture Committee.

Sens. Bercier, Mathern and Reps. Boucher, Svedjan, Tieman introduced:

SCR 4025: A concurrent resolution urging Congress to promote development of North Dakota's wind energy resource by appropriating funds to provide a two and one-half cents per kilowatt hour wind energy production tax credit.

Was read the first time and referred to the Finance and Taxation Committee.

Sens. Bercier, Mathern and Reps. Boucher, Svedjan, Tieman introduced:

SCR 4026: A concurrent resolution urging the President and Congress to provide sufficient funding for implementation of the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001.

Was read the first time and referred to the Education Committee.

Sens. Bercier, O'Connell, Taylor and Rep. Boucher introduced:

SCR 4027: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study whether the use of Bank of North Dakota and State Mill and Elevator profits and the use of moneys in trust funds for general fund purposes is jeopardizing the future economic viability of the Bank of North Dakota and the State Mill and Elevator and reducing the amount of funds available for the dedicated purposes of the trust funds.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

Sens. Robinson, Holmberg, Lindaas and Reps. Boucher, Kerzman, Weisz introduced:

SCR 4028: A concurrent resolution urging Congress to increase Medicare reimbursement rates for rural health care providers and to use an appropriate amount of the federal budget to equalize Medicare rates within North Dakota and the nation.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

Sens. Robinson, Bercier and Reps. Boucher, Drovdal, Onstad introduced:

SCR 4029: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study issues relating to the Indian population of the state, including sovereignty, educational opportunities, population dispersement, unemployment, health concerns, suicide rates, living conditions, and impact on the caseloads of the Department of Human Services and the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator Christmann's motion.
