- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-10-41 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the centers of excellence program; to repeal section 15-10-41 of the North Dakota
- 3 Century Code, relating to the centers of excellence program; to provide for a report to the
- 4 legislative council; and to provide an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-10-41 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 15-10-41. Centers of excellence Centers of excellence commission Budget
 section approval.
 - The state board of higher education shall establish a centers of excellence
 program relating to economic development consistent with the purpose under
 subsection 2 through which the centers of excellence commission awards funds to
 research universities, university-related foundations, and public institutions that are
 located in the state.
- 15 2. In this section, unless the context otherwise requires:
 - a. "Center" means a center of excellence relating to economic development.
- 17 b. "Commission" means the centers of excellence commission.
- 18 c. "Foundation" means the North Dakota economic development foundation.
- 19 d. "Industry cluster" means one of the following industries:
- 20 (1) Advanced manufacturing;
- 21 (2) Aerospace;
- 22 (3) Energy;

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- 1 (4) Information and technology; 2
 - (5)Tourism;
 - (6)Value-added agriculture; or
 - (7) An industry specifically identified by the department of commerce as an industry that will contribute to the gross state product.
 - 3. The centers of excellence commission consists of seven members. The foundation shall appoint two members of the commission, the board shall appoint two members of the commission, and the legislative council shall appoint three members of the legislative assembly as nonvoting members of the commission. The commission members shall designate a chairman and a vice chairman of the commission. Each member of the commission shall serve for a term of two years, beginning July first of each odd-numbered year; may be reappointed for additional terms; and serves at the pleasure of the appointing entity. A member of the commission who is appointed by the legislative council is entitled to receive compensation per day for each day spent in attendance at commission meetings in the same amount as provided for members of the legislative council and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses incurred in the performance of official duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers. A commission member appointed by the board or foundation may receive compensation and travel and expense reimbursement from the appointing entity. The commission shall meet as necessary to review applications, make designation determinations, and make awards of funds. The board shall provide the commission with appropriate staff services as may be requested by the commission.
 - The board shall establish application forms, accept applications, review 4. applications for completeness, and forward complete applications to the commission. The board shall commission and the legislative assembly each may designate centers of excellence a center. A designation by the board of a center of excellence within the economic development category does not preclude the board or a higher education institution from designating a center of excellence in an academic or service area. Centers of excellence relating to economic

development include the North Dakota state university center for technology enterprise and the university of North Dakota center for innovation.

Before January 1, 2004, the board, in consultation with the North Dakota economic development foundation and with private sector input, shall establish definitions and eligibility criteria for centers of excellence relating to economic development. The board shall present the definitions and eligibility criteria for the eenters of excellence relating to economic development to an interim committee designated by the legislative council. The North Dakota economic development foundation may identify and recommend high priority centers of excellence relating to economic development for consideration by the state board of higher education for future budget requests.

- 2. The purpose of the program is to develop
- 5. Before the commission may consider an application for designation as a center, the applicant shall establish in the application how the proposed center will:
 - <u>a.</u> <u>Develop</u> and engage strategies for science and technology research and development, commercialization, entrepreneurship, infrastructure, growth and expansion <u>utilization to assist the growth and expansion</u> of knowledge-based industries, and <u>other</u> activities in the state to develop innovative approaches that expand the gross state product; to assist.
 - b. Create employment opportunities for residents of this state.
 - <u>Assist</u> efforts to attract private and federal assistance for science and technology research and development and for commercialization in growth.
 - <u>Assist efforts to commercialize industry</u> clusters most likely to increase the gross state product; to increase.
 - <u>Increase</u> collaboration among state, federal, and private <u>science and</u>
 <u>technology</u> research and development and technology commercialization
 organizations in the state; to <u>strengthen</u>.
- 6. In designating a center, the commission shall:
 - a. Make a determination that the requirements of subsection 5 have been established by the applicant.
 - b. Consider whether the proposed center will:

Identified industry clusters include advanced 10 manufacturing, aerospace, energy, information and technology, 11 tourism, and value-added agriculture. 12 <u>C.</u> In partnership with the board and the foundation, present the details of a 13 proposed designated center to the budget section for approval. An approved 14 award determination must include details regarding the terms under which the board will distribute allocated funds. 15 16 3. 7. The state In accordance with commission award determinations approved by the 17 budget section, the board of higher education shall allocate funds from 18 appropriations for undesignated centers of excellence relating to economic 19 development based on the criteria established and for the purpose of funding 20 centers. The board, in partnership with the commission and foundation, shall 21 report to the budget section on the status of such allocations, in partnership with 22 the North Dakota economic development foundation, to the budget section and 23 actual fund distributions. 24 8. A recipient of funds awarded under this section shall use the funds to enhance 25 capacity, enhance infrastructure, and leverage state, federal, and private sources 26 of funding. Funds A recipient of funds awarded under this section may not be 27 used use the funds to supplant funding for current operations or academic 28 instruction or to pay indirect costs. The board may award funds under this section 29 to research universities, university related foundations, and public institutions that

are located in the state which demonstrate the potential to deliver expertise and

3	<u>9.</u>	Before funds awarded under this section are distributed to an institution of higher	
4		edu	cation under the control of the board of higher education or which is <u>to</u> a
5		non	profit university-related foundation, the recipient shall:
6		a.	Provide provide the board of higher education with detailed documentation of
7			the availability of two dollars of matching funds for each dollar of funds
8			awarded under this section as a condition of eligibility for receipt of funds
9			under this section; and.
10		b.	Provide An institution of higher education under the control of the board or a
11			nonprofit university-related foundation that receives funds under this section
12			shall provide the board of higher education, governor, and North Dakota
13			economic development foundation with annual reports for four fiscal years
14			following receipt of the funds.
15	SECTION 2. REPEAL. Section 15-10-41 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
16	repealed.		
17	SECTION 3. REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL. During the 2005-06 interim, the		
18	state board of higher education and the centers of excellence commission shall report to the		
19	legislative council on the status of the centers of excellence program. The report must include		
20	information regarding funding, private sector participation, and accomplishments of each center		
21	of excellence and whether there are potential changes that could be made to improve the		
22	centers of excellence program.
