## HOUSE BILL NO. 1213

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 44-04-18.3 of the North Dakota Century Code,  
2 relating to the confidentiality of records containing the telephone number and home address of  
3 juvenile court supervisors and probation officers.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 44-04-18.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 **44-04-18.3. Records of juvenile court supervisors and probation officers and law**  
8 **enforcement and correctional employees - Confidential informants.**

- 9 1. Any telephone number and the home address of a juvenile court supervisor or  
10 probation officer, an employee of a law enforcement agency, employee of a state  
11 or local correctional facility, and an employee of the department of corrections and  
12 rehabilitation are confidential. A record containing information relating to an  
13 employee of the department of corrections and rehabilitation may be disclosed to  
14 an appropriate authority under policy established by the department of corrections  
15 and rehabilitation.
- 16 2. Records or other information that would reveal the identity, or endanger the life or  
17 physical well-being, of an undercover law enforcement officer is confidential. For  
18 purposes of this subsection, an "undercover law enforcement officer" means a  
19 full-time, salaried employee of a local or state law enforcement agency who acts  
20 surreptitiously or poses as someone other than a law enforcement officer while  
21 engaging in the investigation of a violation of law.
- 22 3. A law enforcement officer or prosecutor, within the scope of the employment of the  
23 officer or prosecutor, may provide assurances of confidentiality to a person  
24 providing information regarding violations of the law. Any information that would

- 1 identify or provide a means of identifying a confidential informant, if the identity of
- 2 the informant is not otherwise publicly known, is confidential and may be disclosed
- 3 only as permitted by law.
