- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA: 4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-02-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows: 6 15.1-02-13. School district employee compensation report. 7 Before September eleventh of each year, beginning in 2002, each school district 8 shall provide report the following information to the superintendent of public instruction, with respect to each teacher and class of teachers and with respect to 9 10 each administrator and class of administrators: 11 The total amount of base salary. a. 12 The total amount of compensation reportable as gross income under the <del>b.</del> 13 Internal Revenue Code. 14 Any other compensation paid or provided to or on behalf of individuals 15 employed as teachers and as administrators. 16 Health insurance benefits paid to or on behalf of individuals employed as <del>d.</del>
  - teachers and as administrators.
    - Retirement contributions and assessments paid on behalf of individuals e. employed as teachers and as administrators, and including individual shares if paid by the district.
  - f. Any other benefits paid or provided to or on behalf of individuals employed as teachers and as administrators.

23	<u>3.</u>	The	superintendent of public instruction shall:		
24		a.	Compile the information required by subsection 1 this section in a manner		
25			that allows for accurate comparisons based on:		
26			(1) Full-time versus part-time personnel;		
27			(2) A normal schoolday versus an extended schoolday; and		
28			(3) A regular school calendar of approximately one hundred eighty days		
29			versus an extended school year.; and		
30		b.	Forward a copy of the compiled information to the governor and the chairman		
31			of the legislative council.

29				(5)	A class 41 library media specialist;			
30				(6)	A class 56 pupil personnel service provider;			
31				(7)	A class 59 school psychologist;			

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1	(8)	A class 62 speech-language pathologist;
2	(9)	A class 68 supervisor;
3	(10)	A class 70 teacher or special education teacher; or
4	(11)	A class 72 tutor in training.
