- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 3 of section 43-17-18 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to licensure of physicians.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 3 of section 43-17-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 3. Graduates of international schools.
 - a. An applicant who is a graduate of a medical school not located in the United States, its possessions, territories, or Canada, shall present evidence, satisfactory to the board, that the applicant possesses the degree of doctor of medicine or a board-approved equivalent based on satisfactory completion of educational programs acceptable to the board. Graduates of osteopathic schools located outside the United States are not eligible for licensure.
 - b. An applicant who has graduated from a medical school not located in the United States, its possessions, territories, or Canada, must present evidence, satisfactory to the board, that the applicant has successfully completed three two years of postgraduate training in a program located in the United States, its possessions, territories, or Canada, and accredited by a national accrediting organization approved by the board or other graduate training approved in advance by the board as meeting standards similar to those of a national accrediting organization. However, if such an applicant has not completed three years of postgraduate training in a program approved by the board or by an accrediting body approved by the board, but has met all other licensing requirements and has successfully completed one year of postgraduate training in the United States or Canada in a program approved

1 by the board, and if the board finds that the applicant has other professional 2 experience and training that is substantially equivalent to the second and third 3 year of postgraduate training, then the applicant may be deemed eligible for 4 licensure. The board is granted broad discretion in determining whether to 5 apply this exception to the normal licensing requirements.
