2 43-45-07.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the licensure of addiction counselors.

### 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 43-45-05.1 of the North Dakota

5 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

# SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-45-07.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

18 **43-45-07.1. Grounds for disciplinary proceedings.** The board may deny an

19 application, refuse to renew, suspend, revoke, or place on probationary status any license

20 issued under this chapter on proof at a hearing that the applicant or holder of the license has

21 engaged in unprofessional conduct. Unprofessional conduct includes:
