- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 11-19.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the confidentiality of photographs and video recordings.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 11-19.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 11-19.1-11. Coroner may perform autopsy Notice of results Confidentiality.
- 7 The coroner or the coroner's medical deputy, if the coroner deems it necessary, may take
- 8 custody of the dead body for the purpose of autopsy. When the coroner does not deem an
- 9 autopsy necessary, the sheriff and state's attorney may direct an autopsy be performed. Upon
- 10 the death of a child whose cause of death is suspected by the child's parent or guardian or the
- 11 coroner or the coroner's medical deputy to have been the sudden infant death syndrome, the
- 12 coroner or the coroner's medical deputy, after consultation with the parent or guardian, shall
- 13 take custody of the dead body and shall arrange for the performance of the autopsy by a
- 14 qualified pathologist, unless the county coroner, sheriff, state's attorney, and the parent or
- 15 guardian all agree that an autopsy is unnecessary. The parents or guardian and the state
- 16 health officer shall be promptly notified of the results of that autopsy. Photographs or video
- 17 recordings of an autopsy are confidential and may only be provided to the decedent's
- 18 immediate family, a medical school for use for educational purposes, law enforcement
- 19 agencies, or pursuant to a court order. For purposes of this section, "immediate family" means
- 20 the decedent's spouse, parent, child, or sibling.
