- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 36-01-01 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to membership of the state board of animal health.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 36-01-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows:

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| 7 | 1. | The state board of animal health consists of eight nine members appointed by the |
| 8 | | governor for terms of seven years each with their terms of office so arranged that |
| 9 | | two terms expire on the first day of August in one year and one term expires on the |
| 10 | | first day of August in each of the next six years. The term of the individual |
| 11 | | appointed to represent the nontraditional livestock industry expires on August 1, |
| 12 | | 2010. No individual may be appointed to more than two 7-year terms on the |
| 13 | | board. |
| 14 | 2. | Each member of the board must be a qualified elector of this state. Each member |
| 15 | | of the board, immediately after appointment, shall take the oath of office required |
| 16 | | of civil officers. |
| 17 | 3. | The members of the board must include: |
| 18 | | a. One individual who is actively engaged and financially interested in the |
| 19 | | commercial beef cattle industry and who shall represent the industry on the |
| 20 | | board; |
