SECOND ENGROSSMENT with House Amendments

REENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2194

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for the establishment of a medical assistance buy-in program for
- 2 individuals with disabilities and to provide for personal care services for eligible medical
- 3 assistance recipients; and to provide an expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. Medical assistance buy-in program for disabled. The department of 6 human services shall establish and implement a buy-in program to provide medical assistance 7 to an individual who meets the definition of disabled under the supplemental security income 8 program under title XVI of the federal Social Security Act, who is at least eighteen but less than 9 sixty-five years of age, and who is gainfully employed. The program must:

- Be made available to an individual with a disability who is a member of a family the
 total annual income of which is less than two hundred twenty-five percent of the
 most recently revised official poverty line published by the federal office of
 management and budget for the family;
- Disregard up to an additional ten thousand dollars earned while an eligible
 individual is enrolled in medical assistance and retained as an approved plan to
 achieve self-support;
- Require the payment of a premium that is based upon a sliding scale which may
 not be less than two and one-half percent nor more than seven and one-half
 percent of the individual's income;
- 20 4. Include a one-time program enrollment fee of one hundred dollars; and
- 5. Provide that the failure of an enrolled individual to pay premiums for three
 consecutive months may result in the termination of enrollment in the program.
- 23 **SECTION 2. Personal care services.** Subject to the requirements under title 42,
- 24 Code of Federal Regulations, part 440, section 167, the department of human services shall

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- 1 provide personal care services for eligible medical assistance recipients who are residing in
- 2 their own homes.
- 3 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective through June 30, 2005, and
 4 after that date is ineffective.
