- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 39-10.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the registration of bicycles; and to amend and reenact sections
- 3 39-10.1-01, 39-10.1-05, and 39-10.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the
- 4 operation of bicycles.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-10.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 8 **39-10.1-01.** Effect of chapter Penalty for violation.
- It is unlawful for any person to do any act forbidden or fail to perform any act
 required in this chapter. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this
 chapter may be assessed a fee not to exceed five thirty-five dollars.
- The parent of any child and the guardian of any ward may not authorize or
 knowingly permit any such child or ward to violate any of the provisions of this
 chapter.
- 153. These The provisions applicable to bicycles in this chapter apply whenever to a16bicycle that is operated upon any highway or upon any path set aside for the
- 17 exclusive use of bicycles subject to those exceptions stated herein in this chapter.

18 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 39-10.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
19 amended and reenacted as follows:

39-10.1-05. Riding on roadway and bicycle path.

Every <u>A</u> person operating a bicycle upon a roadway shall ride as near to the right
 side of the roadway as practicable, exercising due care when passing a standing
 vehicle or one proceeding in the same direction.

1	2.	Persons riding bicycles upon a roadway may not shall ride more than two abreast,	
2		except single file. However, on paths or parts of roadways set aside designated	
3		specifically for the exclusive use of bicycles, bicycle riders may ride two abreast.	
4	3.	Wherever If a usable path for bicycles has been provided adjacent to a roadway,	
5		bicycle riders shall use such the path and may not use the roadway.	
6	SEC	CTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 39-10.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
7	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:	
8	39- 1	0.1-07. Lamps and other equipment on bicycles Nighttime lamps and	
9	9 <u>clothing - Brakes</u> .		
10	1.	Every A bicycle when in use at night time within the time period of one-half hour	
11		after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise must be equipped with a front lamp on	
12		the front which that emits a white light visible from a distance of at least five	
13		hundred feet [152.4 meters] to the front and with a red reflector light on the rear of	
14		a type approved by the department. A lamp emitting that emits a red light visible	
15		from a distance of five hundred feet [152.4 meters] to the rear may be used in	
16		addition to the red reflector. An operator of a bicycle within the time period of	
17		one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise shall wear an outer	
18		garment with some reflectionized material.	
19	2.	Every <u>A</u> bicycle must be equipped with a brake which will enable the operator to	
20		make the braked wheels skid on dry, level, clean pavement.	
21	SEC	CTION 4. A new section to chapter 39-10.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
22	created and	l enacted as follows:	
23	Bicy	cle registration requirements - Fees - Dedication of funds.	
24	<u>1.</u>	An individual may not ride a bicycle upon any highway outside of the geographical	
25		boundaries of a city without displaying evidence of registration required by this	
26		section. This section does not apply to a bicycle with under three gears or a bike	
27		being ridden by an individual fourteen years of age or under. In addition, this	
28		section is limited to a bicycle intended to be ridden for long distances, including a	
29		cross-country racer, cruiser, touring bike, or racing bike.	
30	<u>2.</u>	The operator of a bicycle shall register the bicycle with the department and the	
31		department shall issue upon payment of fifty dollars a decal for placement on the

1		bicycle as evidence of registration. A registration is effective for two calendar
2		<u>years.</u>
3	<u>3.</u>	Fees collected under this section must be deposited in the highway fund for use for
4		the construction and maintenance of bicycle paths and parts of roadways designed
5		specifically for bicycles in areas outside the geographical boundaries of a city.
