- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsections 2 and 13 of section 43-11-01, sections
- 2 43-11-04 and 43-11-06, subsection 3 of section 43-11-16, section 43-11-24, subsection 3 of
- 3 section 43-11-27, and subsection 1 of section 43-11-28 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 4 relating to licensing of cosmetologists and cosmetology schools.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsections 2 and 13 of section 43-11-01 of the North Dakota Century Code are amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 2. "Cosmetology" means any one or combination of practices generally and usually performed by and known as the occupation of beauty culturists or cosmeticians or cosmetologists or hairdressers, or of any other person holding out as practicing cosmetology by whatever designation and within the meaning of this chapter and in and upon whatever place or premises; and in particular cosmetology includes the following or any one or a combination of practices: arranging, dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, singeing, bleaching, coloring, or similar work, upon the hair of any person by any means or with hands or mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliances, or by the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams, or otherwise, massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, exercising, waxing to remove hair, beautifying, or similar work on the scalp, face, neck, arms, hands, bust or upper part of the body, or manicuring the nails of any person.
 - 13. "Skin care" means the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams, or otherwise, massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, <u>waxing to remove hair</u>, beautifying, or similar work on the scalp, face, neck, arms, hands,

3	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is						
4	amended and reenacted as follows:						
5	43-11-04. Members of board - Qualifications. Each member of the board must be a						
6	citizen of this state and a licensed cosmetologist who has had at least three years practical						
7	perience in the occupation. No two members of the board may be members of or affiliated						
8	vith any school of cosmetology, nor may any two members of the board be graduates of the						
9	ne school of cosmetology.						
10	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is						
11	amended and reenacted as follows:						
12	43-11-06. Compensation of members of board - How paid. Each member of the						
13	board is entitled to receive compensation of fifty one hundred dollars for each day employed in						
14	the actual discharge of official duties, as determined by the board. The secretary of the board						
15	shall receive an annual salary of not more than thirteen thousand dollars to be fixed by the						
16	board, and necessary expenses actually incurred in the performance of official duties.						
17	Expenses incurred by a board member in the performance of an official function are payable by						
18	the board pursuant to sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09. The compensation and expenses of all						
19	members of the board must be paid from the license fees and other sources of income of the						
20	board.						
21	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 43-11-16 of the North Dakota						
22	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:						
23	3. Employs at least two full-time licensed instructors for the first twenty-five students						
24	enrolled and one additional instructor for each additional twenty five students						
25	enrolled or fraction thereof and maintains a maximum student-to-instructor ratio of						
26	twenty-four-to-one based on current enrollment, except a school that provides						
27	training and instruction limited to esthetics or manicure shall employ at least one						
28	full-time instructor for the first twelve students enrolled and one additional						
29	instructor for each additional twelve students enrolled or fraction thereof maintain a						
30	maximum student-to-instructor ratio of twelve-to-one based on current enrollment;						

1 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-24 of the North Dakota Century Code is 2 amended and reenacted as follows: 3 43-11-24. Operator's license - When issued - Failure to pass examination -4 **Reexamination - Retraining.** An operator's license must be issued to any person who has: 5 1. Complied with section 43-11-21; and 6 2. Passed to the satisfaction of the board, the examination of applicants for a license 7 to practice under this chapter. 8 If the applicant fails to pass the examination, the examination fee may not be returned. Within 9 one year after failing If an applicant fails to pass an examination, the applicant may be 10 examined again with the payment of a reexamination fee as set forth in section 43-11-28. A 11 person An applicant who fails to pass the first reexamination must complete an additional one 12 hundred sixty hours of training at a school of cosmetology before reapplying applying for 13 examination a second reexamination. 14 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 43-11-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 15 16 No person is entitled to renew an instructor's license unless the instructor has 3. 17 furnished to the board evidence of attendance at an approved seminar pursuant to 18 requirements prescribed by the board completion of the continuing education 19 established by the board by rule. 20 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.
