1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 19-20.2 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to transportation and tampering with containers of anhydrous ammonia;

- 3 to amend and reenact section 19-20.2-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a
- 4 penalty for violation of the chapter; and to provide a penalty.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 19-20.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 created and enacted as follows:

10		<u>a.</u>	Place, or have placed, or possess anhydrous ammonia in a container that is	
11			not designed, constructed, maintained, and authorized to contain or transport

13		<u>b.</u>	Transport anhydrous ammonia in a container that is not designed,	
14			constructed, maintained, and authorized to contain or transport anhydrous	
15			ammonia;	
16		<u>C.</u>	Use, deliver, receive, sell, or transport a container designed and constructed	
17			to contain anhydrous ammonia without the express consent of the owner or	
18			authorized custodian of the container; or	
19		<u>d.</u>	Tamper with any equipment or facility used to contain, store, or transport	
20			anhydrous ammonia.	
21	<u>2.</u>	For	the purposes of this section, containers designed and constructed for the	
22		stora	age and transport of anhydrous ammonia are described in this chapter, rules	
23		<u>ado</u> p	oted pursuant to this chapter, or in Code of Federal Regulations, title 49.

1 "Anhydrous ammonia" means a compound formed by the chemical combination of 3. 2 the elements nitrogen and hydrogen the molar proportion of one part nitrogen to 3 three parts hydrogen. This relationship is shown by the chemical formula NH₃. On 4 a weight basis, the ratio is fourteen parts nitrogen and three parts hydrogen or 5 approximately eighty-two percent nitrogen to eighteen percent hydrogen. 6 Anhydrous ammonia may exist in either a gaseous or a liquid state. 7 "Tamper" means action taken by a person not authorized to take that action by law 4. 8 or by the owner or authorized custodian of an anhydrous ammonia container or of 9 equipment where anhydrous ammonia is used, stored, distributed, or transported. 10 5. A person who willfully violates this section is guilty of a class C felony. 11 SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 19-20.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is 12 created and enacted as follows: 13 No cause of action for person tempering. 14 Except as provided in subsection 2, a person tampering with anhydrous ammonia 1. 15 containers or equipment under section 1 of this Act does not have a cause of 16 action for damages arising out of the tampering against: 17 The owner or lawful custodian of the container or equipment; a. 18 b<u>.</u> A person responsible for the installation or maintenance of the container or 19 equipment; or 20 A person lawfully selling or offering for sale the anhydrous ammonia. C. 21 Subsection 1 does not apply to a cause of action against a Subsection 1 does not 22 apply to a cause of action against a person who unlawfully obtained the anhydrous 23 ammonia or anhydrous ammonia container or who possesses the anhydrous 24 ammonia or anhydrous ammonia container for any unlawful purpose. 25 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 19-20.2-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 26 amended and reenacted as follows: 27 19-20.2-10. Penalty. 28 Any Except as provided by section 1 of this Act, any person violating this chapter is 1. 29 guilty of a class A misdemeanor. 30 2. When construing and enforcing the civil provisions of this chapter, the act, 31 omission, or failure of any officer, agent, or other person acting for or employed by

1		any person is deemed to be the act, omission, or failure of the person as well as
2		that of the person employed.
3	3.	In addition to the criminal sanctions that may be imposed, a person found guilty of
4		violating this chapter or the rules adopted under this chapter is subject to a civil
5		penalty not to exceed five thousand dollars for each violation. The civil penalty
6		may be imposed by a court in a civil proceeding or by the agriculture commissioner
7		through an administrative hearing.
