- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 39-10.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to bicycle safety promotion; to amend and reenact sections 39-10.1-02,
- 3 39-10.1-03, 39-10.1-04, 39-10.1-05, 39-10.1-06, 39-10.1-07, and 39-10.1-08 of the North
- 4 Dakota Century Code, relating to bicycle operation and safety; to repeal section 39-10.1-01 of
- 5 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a penalty; to provide a penalty; and to provide a
- 6 continuing appropriation.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-10.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 39-10.1-02. Traffic laws apply Application to persons riding individuals
- 11 **operating bicycles.** Every person riding An individual operating a bicycle upon a roadway is
- 12 granted road has all of the rights and is subject to all of the duties applicable to the driver of a
- 13 motor vehicle by this title, except as to special regulations in this title and except as to those
- 14 <u>provisions that apply only to motor vehicles and provisions of this title which that</u> by their nature
- 15 can have no application to bicycles. For purposes of this section, "road" means every way or
- 16 place generally open to the use of the public as a matter of right, for the purpose of motor
- 17 vehicle travel, notwithstanding that due to construction, reconstruction, repair, or maintenance
- 18 the way or place may be temporarily closed or subject to restricted travel.
- 19 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-10.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- amended and reenacted as follows:
- 21 **39-10.1-03.** Riding on Operating a bicycle.
- 22 1. A person propelling While operating a bicycle may not ride other than upon or
- 23 astride a permanent and regular, an individual shall sit upon a seat attached
- 24 therete to the bicycle or shall stand upon the bicycle's pedals.

1	2.	No An individual operating a bicycle may be used to carry more persons at one	
2		time than the number for which it is designed and equipped not transport any other	
3		individual unless:	
4		a. The individual being transported is seated in or on an auxiliary seat designed	
5		for attachment to the bicycle;	
6		b. The individual being transported is seated in or on an auxiliary trailer designed	
7		for attachment to a bicycle; or	
8		c. The bicycle is specifically designed to transport one or more individuals in	
9		addition to the operator.	
10	SEC	CTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 39-10.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
11	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:	
12	39- 1	0.1-04. Clinging to vehicle. No person riding upon any An individual operating a	
13	bicycle , coa	ster, roller skates, sled, or toy vehicle may attach the same or the person's self to	
14	any may not hang on or in any way secure either the individual or the bicycle to a motor vehicle		
15	upon a roadway, except a sled for the purpose of being pulled by a snowmobile while on the		
16	<u>bicycle</u> .		
17	SEC	CTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 39-10.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
18	amended and reenacted as follows:		
19	39-1	0.1-05. Riding on roadway and bicycle path.	
20	1.	Every person operating a bicycle upon a roadway shall ride as near to the right	
21		side of the roadway as practicable, exercising due care when passing a standing	
22		vehicle or one proceeding in the same direction.	
23	2.	Persons riding bicycles upon a roadway may not ride more than two abreast,	
24		except on paths or parts of roadways set aside for the exclusive use of bicycles.	
25	3.	Wherever a usable path for bicycles has been provided adjacent to a roadway,	
26		bicycle riders shall use such path and may not use the readway. An individual	
27		operating a bicycle on a road is entitled to the full use of a lane and shall comply	
28		with all traffic rules otherwise applicable to motor vehicles.	
29	<u>2.</u>	An individual operating a bicycle on a road at less than the posted motor vehicle	
30		speed limit shall accommodate the passage of a faster moving vehicle by	
31		proceeding to the right half of the lane in which the individual is traveling provided	

1		that the right half of the lane is free of any fixed or moving object, any parked or	
2		moving vehicle, pedestrian, animal, surface debris, surface impairment, standing or	
3		running water, snow, ice, or other weather-related hazard, or any other condition	
4		hazardous to the individual.	
5	<u>3.</u>	An individual operating a bicycle shall use a paved path located adjacent to a road	
6		rather than the road itself if:	
7		a. The path is designed and built for the exclusive use of individuals operating	
8		bicycles;	
9		b. The path is clearly marked as being for the exclusive use of individuals	
10		operating bicycles; and	
11		c. The condition of the path does not jeopardize the safety of an individual	
12		operating a bicycle on the path.	
13	SEC	CTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 39-10.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
14	amended and reenacted as follows:		
15	39-	10.1-06. Carrying article Transporting object - Interference with safe operation	
16	of bicycle.	No person An individual operating a bicycle may carry any package, bundle, or	
17	article whic	h prevents the driver from keeping at least one hand upon the handlebars not	
18	transport ar	ny object if doing so prevents the individual from safely operating the bicycle.	
19	SEC	CTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 39-10.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
20	amended and reenacted as follows:		
21	39-	10.1-07. Lamps and other equipment on bicycles.	
22	1.	Every An individual operating a bicycle when in use at nighttime must be equipped	
23		with during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall attach to the front of the	
24		bicycle or wear a lamp en the front which emits emitting a white or yellow light	
25		visible from a distance of at least five hundred feet [152.4 meters] to the front and	
26		with a red reflector on the rear of a type approved by the department.	
27	<u>2.</u>	A An individual operating a bicycle during the hours between sunset and sunrise	
28		shall attach to the rear of the bicycle or wear a lamp emitting a red light visible from	
29		a distance of five hundred feet [152.4 meters] to the rear may be used in addition	
30		to the red reflector.	

1	2. <u>3.</u>	Every bicycle must be An individual may not operate a bicycle unless it is equipped	
2		with a brake which will enable the operator to make the braked wheels skid on dry,	
3		level, clean pavement in good working condition and adequate to control the	
4		movement of and stop the bicycle.	
5	SEC	CTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 39-10.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
6	amended and reenacted as follows:		
7	39-10.1-08. Penalty - Point system not applicable.		
8	<u>1.</u>	Any individual who violates a provision of this chapter for which another penalty is	
9		not established may be assessed a fee of up to five dollars per violation.	
10	<u>2.</u>	Any violation of this chapter, or and any moving violation as defined in section	
11		39-06.1-09, or any nonmoving violation as defined in section 39-06.1-08 when	
12		committed on by an individual operating a bicycle as defined in section 39-01-01,	
13		is not cause for the licensing authority to assess points against the driving record o	
14		the violator pursuant to section 39-06.1-10.	
15	<u>3.</u>	Any other legally authorized penalty for a criminal traffic offense or noncriminal	
16		traffic violation is applicable to bicyclists an individual operating a bicycle.	
17	SECTION 8. A new section to chapter 39-10.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
18	created and enacted as follows:		
19	<u>Bic</u>	ycle safety promotion fund - Continuing appropriation. All fees collected by a	
20	state, county, or city official for violation of this chapter must be forwarded to the state treasure		
21	for deposit in a special account in the state treasury known as the bicycle safety promotion		
22	fund. All moneys in the fund are appropriated on a continuing basis to the department of		
23	transportation for the purpose of providing grants to public and private sector organizations that		
24	promote bicycle safety.		
25	SEC	CTION 9. REPEAL. Section 39-10.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
26	repealed.
