- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for state employee compensation increases and to
- 2 declare an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - STATE EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated and from special funds derived from federal funds or other income as indicated to the agencies and institutions of state government for the purpose of providing compensation adjustments to employees of the various agencies and institutions in accordance with section 12 of this Act for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2005.

23 SECTION 2. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - STATE EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION

ADJUSTMENTS - GUIDELINES. It is the intent of the fifty-ninth legislative assembly that 2003-05 compensation adjustments for permanent employees are to be an increase of one percent effective retroactively to the month of January 2004 and two percent effective retroactively to the month of January 2005.

An employee must have been employed by the agency on the retroactive effective date of the increase in order to be eligible for the increase.

An employee whose documented performance levels do not meet standards is not eligible for the general increases.

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- 1 A probationary employee is not entitled to the general increases. However, a
- 2 probationary employee may be given all or a portion of the increases upon completion of
- 3 probation, at the discretion of the appointing authority.
- 4 During the biennium, no salary increase other than those authorized under this section
- 5 may be given to an employee whose salary exceeds or would exceed the salary range
- 6 maximum.
- 7 **SECTION 3. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to an emergency measure.
