- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 39-24.2 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the bonding and regulation of snowmobile dealers; and to provide a penalty.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 39-24.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
- 5 enacted as follows:

6 **39-24.2-01.** Snowmobile dealer license - Penalty

- A person may not engage, advertise as being, or hold out to the public as engaging
 in the business of buying, selling, or exchanging snowmobiles without a dealer's
 license. A person who violates this subsection is guilty of a class B misdemeanor.
- Application for a dealer's license and renewal license must be made to the director
 on a form prescribed and furnished by the director. A dealer's license expires on
 September thirtieth of each odd-numbered year and application for renewal of a
 dealer's license must be made before the expiration date of the current dealer's
 license. The application fee is forty dollars and the renewal fee is forty dollars. An
 applicant must pay an additional nonrefundable inspection fee of one hundred
 dollars, which must accompany the initial application.
- Upon licensure, a snowmobile dealer is entitled to be issued a dealer decal
 distinctly marked with the dealer's license number. A dealer decal may be used
 only on snowmobiles owned by the dealership. Additional dealer decals are forty
 dollars each per license period.

- A snowmobile dealer shall maintain a permanent office and place of business in
 this state and shall maintain in that location that dealer's business records relating
 to the sale of snowmobiles in this state.

1 2 2. A snowmobile dealer shall submit any state fees, taxes, and applications collected on behalf of a customer to the department within fifteen days of the date of sale.

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39-24.2-03. Bond and liability insurance required.

- 4 1. Before the issuance of a snowmobile dealer's license, the applicant for the license 5 and at all times each dealer shall furnish a surety bond in the amount of ten 6 thousand dollars executed by the applicant or dealer as principal and executed by 7 a surety company licensed and qualified to do business within this state. The bond 8 must be conditioned upon the faithful compliance by the dealer that the dealer will 9 comply with all the laws of this state pertaining to the business of dealing in 10 snowmobiles and indemnifying any person dealing or transacting business with the 11 dealer in connection with any snowmobile from any loss or damage occasioned by 12 the failure of the dealer to comply with the laws of this state. The aggregate liability 13 of the surety to all persons for all losses or damages may not exceed the amount 14 of the bond. Any third party sustaining injury within the terms of the bond may 15 proceed against the principal and the surety without making the state a party to the 16 proceeding. Any applicant bonded pursuant to chapter 39-22 may not be required 17 to furnish the surety bond required by this section if the bond issued pursuant to 18 chapter 39-22 is written to include the requirements of this section.
- A snowmobile dealer must provide proof to the director of a continuous policy of
 general liability insurance in the minimum amount of one hundred thousand dollars
 per person and three hundred thousand dollars per accident.

39-24.2-04. Suspension or revocation of license - Fees.

- The director may adopt rules governing the suspension or revocation of a dealer's
 license. The director may inspect a dealer's place of business in this state and any
 record of a dealer relating to a snowmobile.
- The director may suspend or revoke any dealer's license for the failure of the
 licensee to comply with any law of this state or rule adopted by the director
 governing snowmobile dealers.
- Any dealer violating any law of this state governing snowmobile dealers must be
 assessed one hundred dollars for the first violation in two years and two hundred
 dollars for a second similar violation within two years of the first violation. The

- director shall suspend the license if a third or subsequent similar violation occurs
 within five years of the first violation.
- Any fees collected by the director under sections 39-29.1-04 through 39-29.1-04.3
 must be deposited with the state treasurer in the state highway fund.
