1 A BILL for an Act to amend react sections 5-01-08 and sections 5-02-06 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to the use of alcohol by a person under twenty-one years of age years of3 age.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 5-01-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7	5-01-08. Persons under twenty-one years of age prohibited from manufacturing,
8	purchasing, consuming, or possessing <u>using</u> alcoholic beverages or entering licensed
9	premises - Penalty - Exceptions - Referrals to addiction facilities - Jurisdiction.

- Except as permitted in this section and section 5-02-06, a person under twenty-one years of age may not manufacture or attempt to manufacture, purchase or attempt to purchase, consume or have recently consumed other than during a religious service, be under the influence of, be in possession of, or furnish money to any person for the purchase of an alcoholic beverage , or
- A person under twenty-one years of age may not enter any licensed premises
 where alcoholic beverages are being sold or displayed, except a:
- 17 <u>a.</u> <u>A</u> restaurant when <u>if</u> accompanied by a parent or legal guardian, or in
- 18 <u>b.</u> <u>In</u> accordance with section 5-02-06, or if
- 19<u>c.</u>If the person is a law enforcement officer or other public official who enters the20premises in the performance of official duty, or if
- 21d.If the person enters the premises for training, education, or research purposes22under the supervision of a person twenty-one or more years of age with prior23notification of the local licensing authority.

- <u>Any A</u> person under twenty-one years of age may remain in an area of a site
 where beer, wine, or sparkling wine is sold in accordance with the conditions of an
 event permit issued pursuant to section 5-02-01.1.
- 4 Any A person who is nineteen years of age or older but under twenty-one years of <u>4.</u> 5 age may be employed by the restaurant to serve and collect money for alcoholic 6 beverages, if the person is under the direct supervision of a person twenty-one or 7 more years of age, but may not be engaged in mixing, dispensing, or consuming 8 alcoholic beverages. Any establishment where alcoholic beverages are sold may 9 employ persons from eighteen to twenty-one years of age to work in the capacity of 10 musicians under the direct supervision of a person twenty-one or more years of 11 age.
- 12 5. In this section, a person is twenty-one years of age after 8:00 a.m. on that person's
 13 twenty-first birthday.
