Minutes: HB 1528 Relating to maintenance of the veterans' memorial on the capitol grounds.

Chairman Haas: The meeting will come to order, please. The House Government and Veterans Affairs Committee to order and the ask the clerk to take the roll, please, thank you. The chair declares that we have a quorum and we will open the hearing on HB 1528 and ask the clerk to read the title. Thank you. Good morning Rep. Metcalf.

Rep. Ralph Metcalf-District 24-Introducing the bill. The bill that you see before you is to establish responsibility for the Veterans Memorial, which is located on the capital grounds. The problem is that it needs repair and improvement. What mainly brought this on is the current involvement in Afghanistan and Iraq which has created historically additional names to placed on that veterans memorial. I would like to present the amendment that I have to the current bill. It changes the current structure quite well. Rep. Kasper can solve some of the problems that you had with the original bill. This bill proposes a responsibility in getting the repairs made to the Veterans Memorial.

Rep. Kasper: Who is currently responsible for maintain and keeping good repair to the Veterans

Memorial?

Rep. Metcalf: The capital grounds personnel.

Chairman Haas: Any further questions for Rep. Metcalf, thank you for presenting the bill for us. Additional testimony.

Merl Paaverud-Director of the State Historical Society of North Dakota-Testimony

Rep. Grande: Instead of redoing the entire work, could we just have another set of panels put together that talks about corrections and additions. Do we have room for that?

Merl: I think there is a whole bunch of things that need to be put on the table and considered.

Rep. Galvin: How could they make so many mistakes.

Merl: This is the question for the ages. We don't know. This was a Centennial project, they were probably pushed to get this done. We have to deal with it now. We have had people come in and they are hurt and concerned, some of them can't find there loved ones name, or it is misspelled, or relative. The issue is there and with this bill we will get it done.

Chairman Haas: What would be the possible future relationship between the historical society and facilities management, either maintaining or adding to the memorial.

Merl: Giving you a little background, we work with facility management, they maintain the building, this would be on going if we sit down and look at additional things and we can provide technical assistance. We have backgrounds in producing plaques.

Chairman Haas: Would the historical society take on that responsibility of ensuring accuracy of information that went on new plaques?

Merl: We would welcome the opportunity to share in that.

Rep. Sitte: You would be sure this would be accurate or are you just responding to complaints?

Merl: What we are doing right now is responding to complaints. We haven't had a chance to review it.

Chairman Haas: Are there further questions for Merl? Thank you very much, thank you for being here. Is there further testimony. Rep. Boucher good morning.

Rep. Merle Boucher-District 9-For-I was quite involved in the evolutionary of this bill. It is a very appropriate, very fitting memorial to the people of North Dakota who have given there ultimate sacrifice during war time. The unfortunate thing is that put together with good intentions, its there and some what forgotten. There are some issues with some names and some identifies of the folks, misspelled, they are inappropriately labeled, in some cases we had names that were omitted. A very big concern to the people in North Dakota. In respect to those citizens and there families the proper respect should be given to them and there families.

Rep. Boehning: I walked out there and look how the monument was set up and then I started looking at the structure. The monument needs a lot of work and I don't think what your bill is going to do here is we don't allow the money for the kind of repair it really needs. I would like to see if we could put some money into the budget to do some maintenance on it. Have you taken a look at the aspect of it?

Rep. Boucher- Certainly we have taken a look at that aspect of it. We are looking at the plaques, basically I think what has happened, it has become a forgotten part of the capital and the grounds. We need to make the folks in certain situations aware of what are concerns are.

Chairman Haas: Thank you Rep. Boucher, any further questions, thank you very much.

Additional testimony.

John A. Boyle-Director of Facility Management-Office of Management and Budget- I agree with what the Representatives have said and Merl. How many names are on the plaques and how many errors are actually known and we did a little research and there are actually 54 panels and there is approximately 4300 names. The inaccurate known errors is on the <u>hand out</u>.

Chairman Haas: John you said that known error. Before we replace the panels, we would want to do further research into the accuracy of the rest of the information?

John: Yes, that is correct. I have a fellow on my staff, he is a member of the VFW and a high ranking member. He has actually taken it upon himself, over the years, to go through every single name, he is the one the worked to help compile this list and he is has gone to actual grave sites, to each of these names, to see how they are actually spelled on the tombstone. He has done a thorough job of all the names that are on the plaques that are known errors. What we don't know is how many names are actually missing from the plaques. They really did a thorough job from the very beginning. Getting the county records and looking through them. During World War 1 and World War 2, they didn't have computers. They were all written. Meadow Larks in Mandan are the ones that produce the plaques. There was a lot of work that went into this, through the Veterans Administration, Meadow Larks, but unfortunately there were some errors made. Are you going to correct every single error, probably not.

Rep. Amerman: This is a suggestion as I look at the plaques here, they are all engraved on the marble, instead having them engraved, this is just a suggestion, you could have a nice brass thing

that could screw in, if there would be errors in the future, they could remove that one main and then replace that.

Chairman Haas: Further questions for John? John do you know, maybe there are veterans that could answer this question better, how would three-hundred and fifty thousand dollars raised initially?

John: The history that I understand, they went out and got pledges from all the veterans organizations throughout the state, so the state didn't contribute any funds towards the initial installation. The veterans groups actually maintain it as well. There was a time that the veterans groups came to the capital grounds planning commission and asked if we could help maintain the memorial, by changing the light bulbs, the flag. One thing that has concerns me and unfortunately the reason it hasn't made our lists, is because we can only ask for so much. Rep. Meier: In the past you have gotten your information from the county records, will you

continue to get your information from the county records?

John: I actually didn't get the information, the veterans got that information.

Chairman Haas: Further questions for John? Thank you John. Any further testimony on HB 1528?

Lyle Schuchard-Member of the Administrative Committee on Veterans Affairs-Testimony Attached-For-Commander of the AMVETS POST 9-Bismarck. Speaking about additional funding if needed. We would be willing to contribute money annually to that memorial. Chairman Haas: Are there questions for Lyle? If not, thank you Lyle. Additional testimony if favor of HB 1528?

Austin Gillette-Commander of Post 253-Whiteshield, North Dakota-For-My question to the committee is this, those men who have won the medal of honor deserve a separate place and now that this committee is considering the war memorial, I think it would be appropriate if something similar was done for them. There are only 16 that are on the highest honor list. You guys could consider it. Please consider this medal of honor memorial for those who have earned it. Chairman Haas: Thank you Austin, is there any further questions for Austin, if not thank you very much Austin. Is there any more testimony in favor of HB 1528. Is there any opposition to HB 1528. If not we will close the hearing on SB 1528. Committee members what are your wishes on HB 1528. Is there a motion to move the amendment. Rep. Grande moves the amendments, seconded by Rep. Sitte. Is there any discussion on the amendment. We will have a voice vote on the amendments, everyone in favor say I, oppose no, amendment is carried. At this time we have the amended bill before us. Do we have a motion on HB 1528 as amended? Rep. Sitte moves a DO PASS as AMENDED, is there a second, seconded by Rep. Potter. Any further discussion? If not we will ask the clerk to take the roll on a DO PASS motion on HB 1528 as Amended.

Chairman Krebsbach opens the hearing on HB 1528

To provide for inspection and repair recommendations for the veterans' memorial on the capitol grounds.

Representative Ralph Metcalf - Introduced delayed bill - He said there has been many changes in this bill. Said he doesn't want to be flamboyant just wants the repairs to be correctly and looks nice. He said repairs would be made out of the OMB budget if they cannot complete repairs out of their budget then they will have to look at other funds they have access to. Rep. Metcalf - Replied that the people involved felt having this legislative committee would take more responsibility so hopefully there will be no more errors.

Senator Brown - Asked why they put in there the legislative council shall visit something that is right outside the door. Why shall?

Rep. Metcalf - Said he has found that unless you use the word "shall" there is a good possibility that it will be never. This is the appropriate time to bring the Memorial up to speed to express our thanks to our servicemen.

Senator Brown - Asked if you expect that this visit to happen before session is up. Seems odd to him to specifically say shall visit something.

Rep. Metcalf - He thinks it is important that this is done now. This is very simple situation, just walk out and look at it.

Senator Syverson - Thought since they addressing grounds issues, he wondered about the flag poles out front. He would like to see a grand flag pole.

Rep Metcalf - Said he is not a good person to ask that. He doesn't think they are very impressive either.

Senator Nelson - Told of a new master plan that is being worked on that basically moves the main entrance to the west side of the building. She thinks when they redo the grounds those flag poles will probably be addressed.

Representative Boucher - District 9 - Sponsor of this bill - He said the issue here is to honor the war dead. The people that visit it say there are names missing and out of order and the building

Senator Syverson - Asked his feelings on the flag poles.

Rep. Boucher - Said if it can improve the appearance of the grounds then he is for it.

Senator Krebsbach - Asked why this isn't under the umbrella of the Capitol Grounds and

Rep. Boucher - Said its a cooperative situation between many state agencies.

Merl Paaverud - Director of the State Historical Society of ND - See written testimony.

Senator Syverson - Asked if they would consider a plaque that is able to add names to.

Paaverud - Replied yes, that is necessary. We have new names now to put on there. The original intent of the Memorial was for ND 1st 100 years but if we intend to add to it then that understanding needs to be done.

Senator Syverson - Asked if it had to be brass and he would hope they would bring in Veterans' organizations and get them involved.

John Boyle - OMB Facility Management - Agrees with what has been said. He said there is approximately 4000 names on the Memorial and approximately 90 are misspelled. He said it means a lot to those who have someone there to have it corrected. He said the fiscal note would be for the 07-09 biennium. They do about \$5,000 a year for maintenance. He said the Veterans raised \$350,000 to build the Memorial of that \$70,000 was used to make name corrections. More of the name that were left out not misspelled.

He said he has tried to get the Veterans' to raised \$60,000 and he would match it in his budget but they thought it would be difficult for them to raise that money.

Senator Nelson - Asked where is the Capitol Grounds budget.

Boyle - Said the Capitol Grounds Planning Commission is appropriated \$50,000 every biennium for improvements on the Capitol grounds, anything over that they would have to receive an appropriation from the legislature.

Senator Nelson - Asked what is the time frame for the master plan.

Boyle - Said originally 30 year period, they are now into in to 5 years.

Senator Krebsbach - Asked who serves on the Legislative Committee.

Boyle - Said the Lt. Governor is in charge, 2 Representatives, 2 Senators, someone from the State Historical Society, an appointed architect and 2 other individuals that the Governor appoints. and State Parks and Rec.

Senator Krebsbach - Can see why it needs to be in legislative management because of the dollars that are needed.


