- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for state employee compensation adjustments;
2 and to declare an emergency.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - STATE EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION**

5 **ADJUSTMENTS.** The sums hereinafter listed, or so much of the sums as may be necessary,
6 are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise
7 appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds or other income as indicated to
8 the agencies and institutions of state government for the purpose of providing compensation
9 adjustments to employees of the various agencies and institutions in accordance with section 2
10 of this Act for the period beginning January 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006.

14 **SECTION 2. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - STATE EMPLOYEE RETROACTIVE**

15 **COMPENSATION ADJUSTMENTS - GUIDELINES.** It is the intent of the fifty-ninth legislative
16 assembly that compensation adjustments for permanent state employees are to be increases
17 of four percent for the period January 1, 2005, through June 30, 2006.

18 Employees whose documented performance levels do not meet standards are not
19 eligible for the retroactive increase.

20 Employees hired after January 1, 2005, are not eligible for the retroactive increase.

21 Probationary employees on January 1, 2005, are not entitled to the retroactive increase.
22 However, probationary employees may be given all or a portion of the increase upon
23 completion of probation, at the discretion of the appointing authority.

24 No salary increase other than the four percent effective January 2005 may be given to
25 an employee whose salary exceeds or would exceed the salary range maximum.

26 For purposes of retirement, salary and wage payments made under this Act are
27 deemed earned in the month paid.

28 **SECTION 3. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
