- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 43-12.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the scope of practice of medical assistants; and to amend and
- 3 reenact subsection 9 of section 43-12.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the
- 4 professional regulation of medical assistants as a class of unlicensed assistive persons.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 9 of section 43-12.1-02 of the North Dakota
 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 9. "Unlicensed assistive person" means an assistant to the nurse who regardless of title is authorized by the board to perform nursing interventions delegated and supervised by a nurse. The term includes a medical assistant who meets the qualifications established by the board.
- SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 43-12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 14 <u>Medical assistant Rules Scope of practice.</u>
 - The board shall adopt rules establishing standards for medical assistant scope of practice, education, and training requirements.
- In addition to any other medication and route of administration established by rule,
 the rules adopted by the board must provide that under the delegation and
 supervision of a nurse, a medical assistant may administer to an individual with
 stable, predictable conditions the following medications by the following routes:
- 21 a. Oral, sublingual, and buccal medications;
- 22 <u>b. Eye medications;</u>
- c. Ear medications;
- d. Nasal medications;

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1	<u>e.</u>	Rectal medications and enemas;
2	<u>f.</u>	Vaginal medications;
3	<u>g.</u>	Skin ointments;
4	<u>h.</u>	Topical medications, including patches;
5	<u>i.</u>	Transdermal medications;
6	<u>j.</u>	Metered handheld inhalants;
7	<u>k.</u>	Unit dose nebulizers;
8	<u>l.</u>	Subcutaneous administration; and
9	<u>m.</u>	Intramuscular injection.
