- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-20-02, 15.1-23-13, 15.1-23-14, and
- 2 15.1-23-15 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to home education of students with
- 3 developmental disabilities.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-20-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-20-02. Compulsory attendance - Exceptions.

- The provisions of section 15.1-20-01 do not apply if the person having
 responsibility for the child demonstrates to the satisfaction of the school board that:
 a. The child is in attendance for the same length of time at an approved
 nonpublic school;
 b. The child has completed high school;
- 13 c. The child is necessary to the support of the child's family;
- A multidisciplinary team that includes the child's school district
 superintendent, the director of the child's special education unit, the child's
 classroom teacher, the child's physician, and the child's parent has
 determined that the child has a disability that renders attendance or
 participation in a regular or special education program inexpedient or
- participation in a regular or special education program inexpedient or
 impracticable; or
- e. The child is receiving home education; provided, however, that this exception
 is not available if the child has developmental disabilities as defined by
 subsection 1 of section 25-01.2-01.

28	SECT	ION	3.	AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-23-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
29	amended and reenacted as follows:					

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1	15.1	-23-14. Ghildren with autism Child with a developmental disability - Home				
2	education. Notwithstanding any other law, a A parent may supervise home education for a					
3	developmentally disabled child with autism a developmental disability if:					
4	1.	The child has been determined to be autistic <u>have a developmental disability</u> by a				
5		licensed psychologist;				
6	2.	The child's parent is qualified to supervise home education under this chapter; and				
7	3.	The child's parent files with the superintendent of the child's school district of				
8		residence:				
9		a. A notice that the child will receive home education;				
10		b. A copy of the child's diagnosis of autism a developmental disability prepared				
11		and attested to by a licensed psychologist; and				
12		c. A services plan developed and followed by the child's school district of				
13		residence and the child's parent; or, after providing written notice to the				
14		superintendent of the child's school district of residence, a substitute services				
15		plan, developed and followed, according to section 15.1-23-15, by a services				
16		plan team selected by and compensated by the child's parent.				
17	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-23-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
18	amended and reenacted as follows:					
19	9 15.1-23-15. Children Child with autism a developmental disability - Home					
20	education - Progress reports.					
21	1.	On or before November first, February first, and May first of each school year, a				
22		parent supervising home education for an autistic <u>a</u> child <u>with a developmental</u>				
23		disability under section 15.1-23-14 shall file with the superintendent of the child's				
24		school district of residence progress reports prepared by the services plan team				
25		selected under section 15.1-23-14. If at any time the services plan team agrees				
26		that the child is not benefiting from home education, the team shall notify the				
27		superintendent of the child's school district of residence and request that the child				
28		be evaluated by a multidisciplinary team appointed by the superintendent of the				
29		child's school district of residence.				

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- 1 2. The superintendent of the child's school district of residence shall forward copies of
- 2 all documentation required by this section to the superintendent of public
- 3 instruction.
