## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-22-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:
  - 15.1-22-01. Kindergarten Establishment by board Petition for establishment Request by parent Levy.
    - Upon its own motion, the board of a school district may establish a free public kindergarten for the instruction during a school year of resident children below school age.
    - 2. If the board receives a petition signed by qualified electors residing in the district equal in number to at least twenty percent of those who voted in the most recent annual school district election, the board must submit the question of establishing a kindergarten to the electorate at the next annual or special school district election. The margins of electoral approval provided in section 57-15-14 must be applied written request to provide kindergarten from the parent of a student who will be enrolled in the kindergarten, the board shall either provide at least a half-day kindergarten program for the student or pay the tuition required for the student to attend at least a half-day kindergarten program in another school district.
    - 3. The board of a school district that establishes a kindergarten under this section may levy a tax pursuant to subdivision p of subsection 1 of section 57-15-14.2.

## SECTION 2. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL - KINDERGARTEN SURVEY.

1 An interim committee designated by the legislative council shall conduct a survey 2 of all school districts in the state to determine: 3 The number of school districts that make available a kindergarten program a. 4 having a duration of more than five half days per week; 5 b. The number of school districts that will by a date certain make available a 6 kindergarten program having a duration of more than five half days per week; 7 The number of students in each district who would be eligible to enroll in a C. 8 kindergarten program during each of the ensuing five years; 9 d. The estimated enrollment in a kindergarten program having a duration of 10 more than five half days per week; 11 The direct and indirect costs that a school district might incur if it made e. 12 available a kindergarten program having a duration of more than five half 13 days per week; and 14 f. The number of school districts that would make available a kindergarten 15 program having a duration of more than five half days per week if moneys 16 were appropriated for that purpose. The superintendent of public instruction shall assist the interim committee in 17 2. 18 conducting the survey and in reviewing the results of the survey.
