- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 38-08.1-01 and 38-08.1-04.1 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to definitions and exploration permit requirements to conduct
- 3 geophysical exploration; and to provide an expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 38-08.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:
 - **38-08.1-01. Definitions.** As used in this chapter, unless the context requires otherwise:
- 9 1. "Commission" means the industrial commission.
- "Geophysical exploration" means any method of obtaining petroleum-related
 geophysical surveys.
- "Operator of the land" means the surface owner or the surface owner's tenant of
 the land upon or within one-half mile [.80 kilometer] of the land on which
 geophysical operations are to be conducted.
 - 4. "Permitting agent" means a person who secures a permit from an operator of the land to conduct geophysical exploration activities.
- 17 <u>5.</u> "Person" means and includes any natural person, corporation, limited liability
 18 company, association, partnership, receiver, trustee, executor, administrator,
 19 guardian, fiduciary, or other representative of any kind, and includes any
 20 department, agency, or instrumentality of the state or of any governmental
 21 subdivision thereof.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 38-08.1-04.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 24 **38-08.1-04.1.** Exploration permit.

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1 1. Upon filing a complete application for permit to explore pursuant to section 2 38-08.1-04, the commission may issue to any person desiring to engage in 3 geophysical exploration a "geophysical exploration permit". A person may not 4 engage in geophysical exploration activities in this state without having first 5 obtained a geophysical exploration permit from the commission. 6 2. The permit must show, at a minimum: 7 The name of the person. a. 8 b. The name and address of the resident agent for service of process. 9 That an application to engage in geophysical exploration has been duly filed. C. 10 d. That a good and sufficient surety bond has been filed by the person, naming 11 the surety company and giving its address. 12 3. The permit must be signed by the director of the commission's oil and gas division 13 or the director's designee. The permit is valid for one year. 14 4. Within seven days of initial contact between the permitting agent and the operator 15 of the land, the permitting agent must provide the operator of the land a written 16 copy of chapter 38-11.1. 17 The permittholder permitting agent shall notify the operator of the land at least 5. 18 three seven days prior to before the commencement of any geophysical 19 exploration activity, unless waived by mutual agreement of both parties. The 20 notice must include the approximate time schedule and the location of the planned 21 activity. 22 5. 6. The permit or a photostatic copy thereof must be carried at all times by a member 23 of the crew during the period of geophysical exploration and must be exhibited 24 upon demand of the landowner or tenant operator or county or state official. 25 6. 7. The permitholder shall notify the county auditor or the auditor's designee at least 26 twenty-four hours, excluding Saturdays and holidays, before the permitholder 27 commences geophysical exploration in the county. Notice must include the

approximate time schedule and location of the planned activity.

Upon request of the operator of the land, the permitting agent must have a certified

test performed on the primary domestic, livestock, or irrigation water supply

located on the property to determine the quantity and quality of water from the

1	water supply before commencement of any geophysical exploration activity. The
2	permitting agent must provide a copy of the certified test to the operator of the
3	land. To have a certified test performed by the permitting agent under this
4	subsection, the operator of the land shall notify the permitting agent at least thirty
5	days before the commencement of any geophysical activity.
6	SECTION 3. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective through July 31, 2007, and
7	after that date is ineffective.
