- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 57-40.6-01 and 57-40.6-04 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to prepaid wireless telephone tax for emergency services.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 57-40.6-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - **57-40.6-01. Definitions.** In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
 - 1. "Active prepaid wireless telephone" means a prepaid wireless telephone that has been used or activated by a customer during the month to complete a telephone call for which the customer's card or account was decremented.
 - 2. "Automated notification system" means that portion of a telecommunications system that provides rapid notice of emergency situations to the public.
- 13 2. 3. "Emergency services communication system" means a statewide, countywide, or
 14 citywide radio system, land lines communication network, wireless service network,
 15 or enhanced 911 (E911) telephone system, which provides rapid public access for
 16 coordinated dispatching of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities for law
 17 enforcement, fire, medical, or other emergency services.
 - 3. 4. "FCC order" means federal communications commission order 94-102 [961 Federal Register 40348] and any other FCC order that affects the provision of wireless enhanced 911 service.
- 5. "Prepaid wireless telephone service" means wireless telephone service that is
 activated by payment in advance, is of a finite dollar amount or for a finite set of
 minutes, and unless an additional finite dollar amount or finite set of minutes is paid
 in advance, terminates either upon use by a customer and delivery by the wireless

1 carrier of an agreed-upon amount of service corresponding to the total dollar 2 amount paid in advance or within a certain period of time following initial purchase 3 or activation. 4 4. <u>6.</u> "Public safety answering point" or "PSAP" means a communications facility 5 operated on a twenty-four hour basis which first receives 911 calls from persons in a 911 service area and which, as appropriate, may directly dispatch public safety 6 7 services or extend, transfer, or relay 911 calls to appropriate public safety 8 agencies. 9 "Subscriber service address" means, for purposes of wire line subscribers, the 5. 7. 10 address where the telephone subscriber's wire line telephone device is used and, 11 for purposes of wireless subscribers, the place of primary use, as that term is 12 defined in the Mobile Telecommunications Sourcing Act [Pub. L. 106-252; 4 U.S.C. 13 124(8)]. 14 "Telephone access line" means the principal access to the telephone company's 6. 8. 15 switched network including an outward dialed trunk or access register. 7. <u>9.</u> 16 "Telephone exchange access service" means service to any wire line telephone 17 access line identified by a unique telephone number that provides local wire line 18 access to the telecommunications network to a service subscriber and which 19 enables the subscriber to access the emergency services communications system 20 by dialing the digits 9-1-1 on the subscriber's telephone device. "Unpublished" means information that is not published or available from directory 21 8. 10. 22 assistance. "Wireless access line" means each active wireless telephone number assigned to 23 11. 24 a commercial mobile radio service subscriber, including end users of resellers. 25 "Wireless enhanced 911 service" means the service required to be provided by 12. 26 wireless service providers pursuant to the FCC order. 27 11. 13. "Wireless service" means commercial mobile radio service as defined in 47 U.S.C. 28 332(d)(1) and includes: 29 Services commonly referred to as wireless; and. a. 30 b. Services provided by any wireless real time two-way voice communication 31 device, including radio-telephone communications used in:

1 (1) Cellular telephone service; 2 (2) Personal communications service; or 3 (3)The functional or competitive equivalent of a radio-telephone 4 communications line used in cellular telephone service, personal 5 communications service, or a network radio access line. 6 C. Prepaid wireless telephone service. 7 "Wireless service provider" means any entity authorized by the federal 12. 14. 8 communications commission to provide wireless service within the state of North 9 Dakota. 10 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 57-40.6-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 11 amended and reenacted as follows: 12 57-40.6-04. Fee collection procedure. 13 A resolution adopted under section 57-40.6-02 must include adequate procedures 14 for the administration and collection of the fee, including a provision for 15 reimbursement to the telephone exchange access service provider and the 16 wireless service provider for the actual costs of administration in collection of the 17 fee, not to exceed five percent of the fee collected. The resolution must also 18 include a provision that the fee be paid by the telephone exchange access service 19 provider and the wireless service provider within thirty days after it is collected from 20 the subscriber. 21 In the case of prepaid wireless telephone service, the service provider shall remit 2. 22 the fee based upon the address associated with the point of purchase, the 23 customer billing address, or the location associated with the mobile telephone

number for each active prepaid wireless telephone that has a sufficient positive

balance as of the last day of each month, if that information is available.
