- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-06-02, 15.1-06-04, and 15.1-27-35 of the
- 2 North Dakota Century Code, relating to professional development days; and to repeal section
- 3 15.1-09-42 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to conference attendance by school
- 4 personnel.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-06-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 **15.1-06-02. School holidays.**
- 9 1. Schools may not be in session on the following holidays:
- 10 a. Any Sunday.
- b. New Year's Day, the first day of January.
- 12 c. Good Friday, the Friday preceding Easter Sunday.
- d. Memorial Day, the last Monday in May.
- e. The anniversary of the Declaration of Independence, the fourth day of July.
- 15 f. Labor Day, the first Monday in September.
- g. Veteran's Day, the eleventh day of November.
- 17 h. Thanksgiving Day, the fourth Thursday in November.
- i. Christmas Day, the twenty-fifth day of December.
- j. Any day declared to be a public holiday by the President of the United Statesor the governor.
- School may not be held on the two days in October that coincide with the North
 Dakota education association conference.

11		1.	Duri	ing each school year, a school district shall provide for a school calendar of at
12			leas	t one hundred eighty days, apportioned as follows:
13			a.	One hundred seventy-three full days of instruction;
14			b.	Two full days of professional development activities for all individuals
15				employed by the district and licensed to teach by the education standards and
16				practices board;
17			<u>C.</u>	Three holidays listed in subdivisions b through j of subsection 1 of section
18				15.1-06-02 and selected by the school board in consultation with district
19				teachers;
20			e.	Two days for the attendance of teachers at the North Dakota education
21				association instructional conference; and
22			d.	Up to two full days during which parent-teacher conferences are held or which
23				are deemed by the school board to be compensatory time for parent-teacher

26			a.	At least five and one-half hours for elementary students, during which time the
27				students are required to be in attendance for the purpose of receiving

A full day of professional development consists of eight hours of activities a. 2 approved by the superintendent of public instruction. 3 In order to have activities approved by the superintendent of public instruction, b. 4 a school district shall submit: 5 (1) A detailed course outline or syllabus, including the method of instruction 6 and materials to be distributed; 7 The qualifications of each instructor presenting material; (2) 8 (3)The procedure to be used for recording attendance; and 9 (4) Any other material required by the superintendent to evaluate the 10 activities. 11 The superintendent of public instruction may approve professional <u>C.</u> 12 development activities in half-day increments, each having a duration of at 13 least four hours, but may not approve any activity having a shorter duration. 14 If a school's calendar provides for an extension of each schoolday beyond the 4. 15 statutorily required minimum number of hours, and if the extensions when 16 aggregated over an entire school year amount to more than eighty-four hours of 17 additional classroom instruction during the school year, the school is exempt from 18 having to make up six hours of instruction time lost as a result of weather-related 19 closure. In order to make up lost classroom instruction time beyond the six hours, 20 the school must extend its normal school calendar day by at least thirty minutes. 21 4. 5. A school that does not qualify under the provisions of subsection 3 must extend its 22 normal schoolday by at least thirty minutes to make up classroom instruction time 23 lost as a result of weather-related closure. 24 5. 6. If because of weather a school must dismiss before completing a full day of 25 instruction, the school is responsible for making up only those hours and portions 26 of an hour between the time of early dismissal and the conclusion of a full day of 27 classroom instruction. 28 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-27-35 of the North Dakota Century Code is 29 amended and reenacted as follows: 30 15.1-27-35. Average daily membership - Calculation. Average daily membership is 31 calculated by adding the total number of days that each student in a given classroom, school, or

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- 1 school district is in attendance during a school calendar and the total number of days that each
- 2 student in a given classroom, school, or school district is absent during a school calendar, and
- 3 then dividing the sum by one hundred eighty. For purposes of calculating average daily
- 4 membership, all students are deemed to be in attendance on:
- The three holidays listed in subdivisions b through j of subsection 1 of section
 15.1-06-02 and selected by the school board in consultation with district teachers;
 - The two days set aside for the attendance of teachers at the North Dakota
 education association instructional conference professional development activities
 under section 15.1-06-04; and
 - 3. The two full days, or portions thereof, during which parent-teacher conferences are held or which are deemed by the board of the district to be compensatory time for parent-teacher conferences held outside regular school hours.
- SECTION 4. REPEAL. Section 15.1-09-42 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
