- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 38-08.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to regulation of geophysical exploration seismic shot hole operations;
- 3 and to amend and reenact sections 38-08.1-01 and 38-08.1-04.1 of the North Dakota Century
- 4 Code, relating to definitions and exploration permit requirements to conduct geophysical
- 5 exploration.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 38-08.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows: 9 **38-08.1-01.** Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the context requires 10 otherwise: 11 1. "Commission" means the industrial commission. 12 2. "Geophysical exploration" means any method of obtaining petroleum-related 13 geophysical surveys. 14 3. "Operator of the land" means the surface owner or the surface owner's tenant of 15 the land upon or within one-half mile [.80 kilometer] of the land on which 16 geophysical operations are to be conducted. 17 4. "Permitting agent" means a person who secures a permit from an operator of the 18 land to conduct geophysical exploration activities. 19 "Person" means and includes any natural person, corporation, limited liability 5. 20 company, association, partnership, receiver, trustee, executor, administrator, 21 guardian, fiduciary, or other representative of any kind, and includes any 22 department, agency, or instrumentality of the state or of any governmental 23 subdivision thereof.

1	SEC	TION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 38-08.1-04.1 of the North Dakota Century Code	
2	is amended and reenacted as follows:		
3	38-0	8.1-04.1. Exploration permit.	
4	1.	Upon filing a complete application for permit to explore pursuant to section	
5		38-08.1-04, the commission may issue to any person desiring to engage in	
6		geophysical exploration a "geophysical exploration permit". A person may not	
7		engage in geophysical exploration activities in this state without having first	
8		obtained a geophysical exploration permit from the commission.	
9	2.	The permit must show, at a minimum:	
10		a. The name of the person.	
11		b. The name and address of the resident agent for service of process.	
12		c. That an application to engage in geophysical exploration has been duly filed.	
13		d. That a good and sufficient surety bond has been filed by the person, naming	
14		the surety company and giving its address.	
15	3.	The permit must be signed by the director of the commission's oil and gas division	
16		or the director's designee. The permit is valid for one year.	
17	4.	Within seven days of initial contact between the permitting agent and the operator	
18		of the land, the permitting agent must provide the operator of the land a written	
19		copy of chapter 38-11.1.	
20	<u>5.</u>	The permitholder permitting agent shall notify the operator of the land at least three	
21		seven days prior to before the commencement of any geophysical exploration	
22		activity, unless waived by mutual agreement of both parties. The notice must	
23		include the approximate time schedule and the location of the planned activity.	
24	5. <u>6.</u>	The permit or a photostatic copy thereof must be carried at all times by a member	
25		of the crew during the period of geophysical exploration and must be exhibited	
26		upon demand of the landowner or tenant operator or county or state official.	
27	6. <u>7.</u>	The permitholder shall notify the county auditor or the auditor's designee at least	
28		twenty-four hours, excluding Saturdays and holidays, before the permitholder	
29		commences geophysical exploration in the county. Notice must include the	
30		approximate time schedule and location of the planned activity.	

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1	<u>8.</u>	Upon request of the operator of the land, the permitting agent must have a certified	
2		test performed on any domestic, livestock, or irrigation water supply located on the	
3		property to determine the quantity and quality of water from the water supply	
4		before commencement of any geophysical exploration activity. The permitting	
5		agent must provide a copy of the certified test to the operator of the land. To have	
6		a certified test performed by the permitting agent under this subsection, the	
7		operator of the land shall notify the permitting agent at least seven days before the	
8		commencement of any geophysical activity.	
9	SE	CTION 3. A new section to chapter 38-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
10	created and enacted as follows:		
11	Sho	ot hole operations - Distance restrictions. Seismic shot hole operations may not	
12	be conduct	ed less than one thousand three hundred twenty feet [402.34 meters] from water	
13	wells, build	ings, underground cisterns, pipelines, stock dams, and flowing springs. Variances	
14	<u>may be gra</u>	inted to this section by written agreement between the permitholder and the operator	
15	of the land.	The agreement is available to the director of the oil and gas division.
