1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study whether enhancing the quality of childcare and increasing access to affordable childcare would favorably impact economic 2 3 development in the state. 4 WHEREAS, childcare makes numerous contributions to quality of life in this state, 5 including enhancing the social and intellectual development of the next generation of North 6 Dakotans; and 7 WHEREAS, childcare is the 10th largest occupation in the state, with annual revenues 8 generated by the childcare industry exceeding \$123 million; and 9 WHEREAS, North Dakota families are very reliant on the childcare industry, due in part 10 to the fact the state has one of the highest rates of multiple jobholders in the nation; and 11 WHEREAS, a North Dakota family with a median family income for the state, \$43,654 in 12 1999, spends approximately 10 to 12 percent of their gross earnings on the care of one infant; 13 and 14 WHEREAS, availability of affordable, quality childcare impacts the ability of the state to 15 attract and retain businesses; 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE 17 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN: 18 That the Legislative Council study whether enhancing the quality of childcare and 19 increasing access to affordable childcare would favorably impact economic development in the 20 state: and 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and 22 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
